CHRISTIAN

- To have faith in Jesus.
- To believe that he died to save me from my sins.

 I must be careful not to "slide back" into trying to earn my salvation.
- Because God has saved me by grace, I will eventually act differently, grow, mature, etc. But again, this is not a requirement for my salvation.
- My job is to trust, believe, and have faith in Jesus.

JESUS


- Enter through the narrow gate

PAUL

"Saved by grace through faith" =

We are saved by the grace of God through our belief (intellectual assent) that Jesus saved us from our sins, NOT through our action.

pistis = allegiance

- faith/belief
 regarding something as true or real
- reliability, confidence, assurance, fidelity, faithfulness, commitment, and pledged loyalty.

ALLEGIANCE

1 Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, 2 which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy Scriptures, 3 concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh 4 and was declared to be the Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by his resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord, 5 through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith (pistis) for the sake of his name among all the nations, 6 including you who are called to belong to Jesus Christ.

From narrow: Optional "growth/maturity."

Added bonus. Icing on the cake.

To wide: Essential.. inseperable from

Salvation.

"Although contemporary Christian culture tends to separate personal salvation and discipleship, allegiance is where they finally meet - and they don't just meet, they embrace. For when we discover that saving "faith" means above all allegiance to Jesus the king, the intimacy between discipleship and salvation is easy to recognize. A person is not first "saved" by "faith" in Jesus' death for sins and then, once that is secured, plugged into a discipleship program as an optional extra in hope that he or she might "grow."

On the contrary, a person is first saved when she or he becomes a disciple by declaring allegiance to Jesus the king - that is, when a person agrees to submit obediently to Jesus's wise and sovereign rule so as to take up his way of life... We are only and ever (past, present, and future) saved by discipleship to Jesus, for to be a disciple is to have declared and enacted *pistis* [a full allegiance] unto Jesus the king."
