Faithfulness: Is it Worth it?

1. God's Faithfulness from beginning to end

- a. What does God aim to accomplish in Genesis?
 - i. Multiplying <u>image-bearers</u> across the world who walk in <u>unity</u> and reveal the <u>glory</u> of God.
 - ii. Genesis 1:28, Genesis 9:1 "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth"
 - iii. **Genesis 11:7–9** "From there the Lord <u>scattered</u> them over the <u>face</u> of the <u>whole</u> earth"
- b. What does He accomplish in Revelation?
 - i. Revelation 21:9 "Come, I will show you the bride, the wife of the Lamb."
 - ii. **Revelation 21:22–26** "The <u>nations</u> will walk by its light" "The glory and honor of the <u>nations</u> will be brought into it"
 - iii. Revelation 22:1-2 "the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations"
 - iv. <u>Image-bearers</u> across the world who walk in <u>unity</u> and reveal the <u>glory</u> of God.

2. God calls for a response of faithfulness

- a. Romans 3:10-12 "There is no one righteous" "no one who seeks God"
- b. **2 Thessalonians 1:8–9** Those who don't know God "will be <u>punished</u> with <u>everlasting destruction</u> and <u>shut</u> out from the <u>presence</u> of the Lord"
- c. Luke 2:10 "good news that will cause great joy for all people"
- d. **2 Peter 3:8–9** "he is <u>patient</u> with you, not wanting <u>anyone</u> to perish, but <u>everyone</u> to come to <u>repentance</u>."
- e. **John 3:16–17** "For God did not send his Son into the world to <u>condemn</u> the world, but to <u>save</u> the world through him."
- f. **John 4:42** "we know that this man really is the <u>Savior</u> of the <u>world</u>."
- g. **Matthew 28:18–20** "All <u>authority</u> in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Therefore <u>go</u> and make <u>disciples</u> of all <u>nations</u>" ... "surely I am <u>with you</u> always, to the very <u>end</u> of the <u>age</u>."
- h. **Romans 10:12–15** "¹⁴ How, then, can they <u>call</u> on the one they have not <u>believed</u> in? And how can they <u>believe</u> in the one of whom they have not <u>heard</u>? And how can they <u>hear</u> without someone <u>preaching</u> to them? ¹⁵ And how can anyone <u>preach</u> unless they are <u>sent</u>?"

3. Is It Worth It?

- a. Philippians 3:7–14 "I count all things to be loss in view of the surpassing <u>value</u> of <u>knowing</u> Christ Jesus my Lord" ... "10 that I may know Him and the <u>power</u> of His <u>resurrection</u> and the <u>fellowship</u> of His <u>sufferings</u>, being conformed to His death" ... "14 I press on toward the <u>goal</u> for the <u>prize</u> of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."
- b. **Matthew 26:36–44** "³⁸ Then He said to them, 'My soul is deeply <u>grieved</u>, to the point of <u>death</u>"" … "³⁹ And He went a little beyond *them*, and <u>fell</u> on His <u>face</u> and prayed, saying, 'My Father, if it is <u>possible</u>, let this cup <u>pass from Me</u>; yet <u>not as I will</u>, but as <u>You will</u>.""
