II. Our Church's Missions Priorities

Priority 1: Prayer

Colossians 4:2-4 – “Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful. And pray for us, too, that God may open a door for our message, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I am in chains. Pray that I may proclaim it clearly, as I should.”

Priority 2: Education

Acts 14:26-27 – “From Attalia they sailed back to Antioch, where they had been committed to the grace of God for the work they had now completed. On arriving there, they gathered the church together and reported all that God had done through them and how he had opened a door of faith to the Gentiles.”

Priority 3: Sending Well

John 20:21 – “Again Jesus said, “Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you.”

Priority 4: Missionary Care

3 John 5-6 – “Dear friend, you are faithful in what you are doing for the brothers and sisters, even though they are strangers to you. They have told the church about your love. Please send them on their way in a manner that honors God.”

Priority 5: Training

2 Timothy 2:2 – “And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others.”

III. What Could Keep Us from Being a Missions-Minded Church?

Why should I love people somewhere in the world that I’ve never met when there are folks down the street who need Jesus? Let’s talk about Jesus’ story of the good Samaritan (Luke 10:29-37).

Luke 10:29 – “But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, “And who is my neighbor?”

1 John 3:18 – “Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth.”

1 Timothy 2:1 – “I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession, and thanksgiving be made for all people.”

Luke 6:35 – “But love your enemies, do good to them, and lend to them without expecting to get anything back. Then your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High, because he is kind to the ungrateful and wicked.”

IV. World Christians

People who understand God's heart for the world and
try to live their lives in such a way that
wherever they are and whatever they do,
they are striving to see Him glorified among all nations.
