

### Gleanings from Paul's Epistles "The Mysterious Man of Sin" 2 Thessalonians 2:1-2

### Setting of the Letter

DATE: Written around A.D. 52.

## CONDITION OF THE CHURCH: See Acts 17:1-10; 2 Thessalonians 1:3-4.

### QUESTIONS ABOUT ESCHATOLOGY:

- In 1 Thessalonians Paul wrote about the return of Christ and what happens to Christians who die before Jesus returns to earth.
- Not long afterward he received a report that the Thessalonians had been thrown into confusion. False teachers claimed to have a message from Paul that the Day of the Lord had already come! (2 Thessalonians 2:2)
- Paul wrote 2 Thessalonians to comfort the church, correct the confusion, and address some problems with idleness.
- His basic message in 2:1-12 is that the Day of the Lord (Christ's second coming to bring judgment on the earth) will <u>not</u> occur until certain events happen first.

# **Events Leading Up to the Day of the Lord**

### 1. The restrainer is taken out of the way.

Verses 6-7 – "And you know what restrains him now, so that in his time he will be revealed. For the mystery of lawlessness is already at work; only he who now restrains will do so until he is taken out of the way."

Who or what restrains lawlessness and prevents the man of sin from assuming power?

### 2. The man of lawlessness is revealed.

Verses 3-4, 9-10 – The Day of the Lord will not come until "the man of lawlessness is revealed, the son of destruction, who opposes and exalts himself above every so-called god or object of worship, so that he takes his seat in the temple of God, displaying himself as being God. [His] coming is in accord with the activity of Satan, with all power and signs and false wonders, and with all the deception of wickedness for those who perish..."

He is a counterfeit Christ...

Jesus	Man of Sin
"Coming" described in v. 8	"Coming" described in v. 9
Relies on power of Holy Spirit	Relies on power of Satan
Performs signs & wonders	Performs signs & wonders
Claims to be God	Claims to be God
Sits on the throne of God	Sits in the temple of God
Speaks truth (v. 10)	Speaks lies (v. 11)

1 John 2:18 – "Dear children, this is the last hour; and as you have heard that <u>the</u> antichrist is coming, even now many antichrists have come. This is how we know it is the last hour."

There have been many antichrists throughout history:

- King of Babylon (Isaiah 14:13-14)
- King of Tyre (Ezekiel 28:2)
- Antiochus Epiphanes 169 BC (Daniel 11:31-36)
- Roman General Titus AD 70 (Matthew 24:15-16)
- See also 1 John 2:22, 4:3

These are all precursors to the Antichrist.

What is the "temple of God" referred to in verse 4?

#### 3. The apostasy comes.

*Verse 3 – "… for it will not come unless the <u>apostasy</u> comes first…"* 

What is the apostasy?

#### 4. The Lord returns.

*Verse* 8 – *"Then that lawless one will be revealed whom the Lord will slay with the breath of His mouth and bring to an end by the appearance of His coming…"*
