Then the Lord spoke to Jonah a second time.

"Arise and go to the great city of Ninevah and deliver the message I gave you."

This time, Jonah obeyed God and shouted to the crowds...

"Forty days from now Ninevah will be destroyed."

The people of Ninevah believed God's message and turned away from their ways, asking for forgiveness.

The people of Ninevah were extremely cruel and treacherous.

And yet even the most wicked and EVIL of people cannot escape God's grace, love, and forgiveness.

God's grace is sufficient even when we are selfish.

He is working to get you back - NOT to get back at you.

Jonah had the knowledge of God's forgiveness and grace, but not a heart for the people.

We love God's grace for our own faults, but not so much for those who offend us.

God's sufficient grace ruins superiority.

We often compare ourselves to others - thinking ourselves more morally righteous.



God came to save those who are MESSED UP - NOT those who are morally good.

God's grace is meant to be shared.

His grace is not intended for us to live in a bubble. It's so we can arise, go and share.
