If you give special attention to someone based on outward appearances or status, doesn't this show that your judgements are guided by selfish motives?

It is good to follow the law to "Love your neighbor as yourself." But if you favor some people over others, you are guilty of breaking that law.

In God's eyes, the person who keeps all the laws except one is just as guilty as the person who has broken all of them.

So remember you will be judged by the law that sets you free. If you haven't shown mercy, you will receive none.

But if you show mercy, God will be merciful to you.


