Discussion Questions:

1. Anna's Background: Anna was a widow who spent decades in the temple worshipping through prayer and fasting (Luke 2:36-37). What does her response to loss and suffering teach us about turning to God in difficult times?
2. Simeon's Anticipation: Before we meet Anna, we read about Simeon who was "waiting for the consolation of Israel" (Luke 2:25). How does living in hopeful anticipation of Christ's return differ from just intellectually believing He'll come back someday?
3. Mary and Joseph's Sacrifice: The sermon pointed out that Mary and Joseph brought the offering of the poor (turtle doves instead of a lamb). What does this detail tell us about God's values versus cultural values around wealth and status?
4. Spiritual Wealth vs. Material Wealth: Have you ever felt "less than" because of financial circumstances? How does the example of Mary, Joseph, and Anna challenge the idea that material wealth equals God's blessing or righteousness?
5. Prayer and Fasting in Suffering: Anna responded to her widowhood with prayer and fasting "night and day." When you face pain or suffering, what is your typical first response? How can you make prayer and fasting a more natural response?
6. Everyday Evangelism: The sermon challenged the idea that sharing Jesus requires formal, intimidating settings. How comfortable are you mentioning Jesus in everyday conversation? What makes it difficult? What would make it more natural?
7. Hopeful Anticipation: When did you last pray "Jesus, come quickly" or lived with urgency about His return? How would your daily life look different if you truly believed Jesus could return today?
8. Passion Assessment: On a scale of 1-10, how passionate are you about Jesus right now? What factors have increased or decreased that passion recently?

Practical Applications:

1. Spend 15 minutes daily in prayer asking God to renew your love for Jesus
2. Read through one of the Gospels (Mark is shortest) looking for things about Jesus that excite you
3. Journal about what Jesus has done in your life that you're grateful for
4. Fast one meal and spend that time in prayer
5. Listen to worship music that focuses on who Jesus is
