 - d. A time of crisis or hardship

Pastor Terry spoke directly to a few things that keep us experiencing the presence of God and he specifically said, "How many of us think we do not experience the presence of God in our city, nation, church, family, homes, and workplaces because of sin? We cannot for one minute believe that revival doesn't occur because of a lack of spirituality...the most spiritual people in the world concluded and rationalized the killing of Jesus." Do you agree or disagree with this statement and why?
