Exodus - from Slavery to Freedom

1 Corinthians 10:1-6.

Exodus 5: 1-6, 22-23

1 Corinthians 10:11 Now all these things happened to them as examples, and they were written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the ages have come.

I. Pharaoh Refuses the Plan of God

(V.1-2)

- A. "Who is the LORD, that I should obey His voice?"
 - LORD = Yahweh, Jehovah, or Adonai
- B. God reveals Himself and His plan to His people.

Jehovah-jireh — the God that provides.

- C. Rebellion against God is seen throughout history.
 - Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden.
 - Israel's rebellion in the wilderness.
- D. God still has a plan to deliver us today.
 - His plan includes our salvation.
 - God's plan includes our obedience to His Word.

1 John 2:4-6

- He who says, "I know Him," and does not keep His commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him.
- ⁵But whoever keeps His word, truly the love of God is perfected in him. By this we know that we are in Him.
- ⁶He who says he abides in Him ought himself also to walk just as He walked.
- God's plan includes His will for our lives.
- Col. 1:9, ...you may be filled with the knowledge of His will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding;
- Romans 12:2, ...by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God.
- E. Do not rebel against God's plan for your life.

II. Pharaoh Rebels against the Person of God (v.2)

- A. "I do not know the LORD!"
- B. Pharaoh stated the condition of his soul.
- C. We can know the Lord by faith in Christ.

III. Pharaoh fought against the People of God (Vs.2-15)

- A. "Nor will I let Israel go"
- B. Pharaoh was angry with Israel and increased their burdens. (v.4-5).
- C. Israel's burdens continued to increase.
- D. Those who love God must also love His people.
