Word from our Pastor

Praises be unto God for the great things He hath done.



A few days ago I stood in a public assembly of Christians and non Christians where we all came to attention and stood to share in the pledge of allegiance to the United States flag. The words of this pledge were repeated by all without any hesitation or reservation.

I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

As the collective body took their seats I began to struggle with my engagement of the pledge as never before. The Holy Spirit sent a flood of activities through my mind that caused me well up in tears. Like never before I became challenged with the words of our pledge of allegiance. Why I asked myself? Whats different this time than on other occasions? The flood of activities racing through my psyche provided me with some of the answers. For a few brief moments my mind raced

through some very vivid pictures of the many injustice and challenges that we have witnessed through various news feeds locally and nationally. Scenes of the senseless murders of persons locally and across our nation, the immoral and in human treatment of persons trying to cross our sacred borders into the US; scenes of playground bickering of adults acting like two and three year olds, scene of racial division, scenes of the government attempting to legislate righteousness, scenes of unequal educational systems, scenes of the rich getting richer and poor and middle class spiraling further and further down the ladder of freedom and success, scenes of inadequate or no health care for all and a dismantling of the American dream of home ownership. Then I asked myself how can all this happen in a nation that stands proud and boast that we are One Nation Under God, Indivisible, with Liberty and Justice for All.

It was at this point that the holy spirt recalled for me a message that I preached some years ago entitled "What does the Lord Require of Thee? Taken from Micah 6:8 for the prophet states: to act justly...love mercy and...walk humbly with your God. As we celebrate this year's Independence Day or Two Hundred Fifth Anniversary Celebration which is often celebrated with food, fireworks, vacationing and the list goes on. Let us not take for granted the basic liberties, freedom and blessings we share in that others do not experience in their daily lives. As we share in this of independence, let us remember what the Lord requires of thee:

(1) "Do right" even when nobody else is. Why? In order to maintain your confidence before God! Nothing in our lives is more important than that.

(2) "Love mercy." Remember the old Nancy Sinatra hit song, "These boots are made for walkin', and that's just what they'll do. One of these days these boots are gonna walk all over you"? Jesus went through life lifting people up, not walking all over them. And His Word to us today is: "Go, and do thou likewise" (Luke 10:37).

(3) "Walk humbly with your God." When God promotes you, your greatest challenge will be to make sure He gets all the glory. Every good thing you have today is a gift from Him; try to remember that!

So the word for us today as we celebrate the birth of our Nation is: "Do right...love mercy and walk humbly with our God."

Church Covenant in Response Service
