Grief doesn’t take a holiday. This season, it’s okay to feel joy and sorrow side by side. These gentle reminders offer ways to care for yourself, honor your memories, and find small moments of peace this season.

Holiday To-Do List

- ❖ **Talk about your grief:** Don’t be afraid to express your grief. Ignoring it won’t make it go away.
- ❖ **Be tolerant of your physical and psychological limits:** You may feel tired and sluggish. Respect what your body and mind are telling you.
- ❖ **Be with supportive/comforting people:** Surround yourself with people who understand that the holiday season increase your sense of loss.
- ❖ **Mention the name of the person who died:** Include them in your holiday conversations.
- ❖ **Do what is right for you during the holidays:** Well-meaning people may try to tell you what is best for you. Only do what feels right to you during the holiday season.
- ❖ **Plan ahead for family gatherings:** Plan ahead on which family traditions you want to continue, and which ones don’t fit this year.
- ❖ **Embrace your memories:** Memories can be a legacy of the one you loved. They can bring laughter and joy as well as sadness. Embrace it all.

Holiday To-Don’t List

- ❖ **Don’t do anything that doesn’t serve you and your loss:** There is no “right way” to do grief, especially during the holidays.
- ❖ **Don’t keep your feelings bottled up:** If you have 1,000 tears to cry, don’t stop at 999.
- ❖ **Don’t overindulge:** This can include food and alcohol.
- ❖ **Don’t be afraid to say “No, thank you”:** It’s ok to skip some things this year.
- ❖ **Don’t feel like you must explain your grief:** If someone doesn’t get it, that’s on them.

Minister: For the good of our own Spiritual development, and for the best interest of the Master's kingdom, what do we promise to do if we move beyond the reach of this church?

Congregation: We moreover engage that when we remove from this place, we will, as soon as possible, unite with some other church of this faith, where we can carry out the spirit of this Covenant and the principles of God's Word.

All: Humbly confessing our past sins, we pray for grace and strength to keep these, our holy vows, for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen
