Relentless Faith and the Witness Stand

John 9:8-34

Big Idea

Grit doesn't just obey — grit speaks.

Even when it is costly, persistent faith does not let up—it holds to the truth of what Jesus has done.

The Scene

John 9: 8-34 CEV

The man has been healed.

Now the questions begin.

Everyone wants answers: neighbors, religious leaders, even his parents.

Witness 1 – The Neighbors (vv. 8–12)



Doubt creeps in.

The man holds to his story.



He says: "Yes, it's me — and I was healed."

Witness 2 – The Pharisees (vv. 13–17, 24–34)

Healing on the Sabbath? That's a problem to them.

 But the healed man stands his ground. Relentless faith says:
"All I know is I was blind, but now I see."

Witness 3 – The Parents (vv. 18–23)

Afraid to speak up.

Fear of being "put out" of the synagogue.

Relentless faith does not cave to fear.

The Man's Bold Statement (v. 33)

"If this man were not from God, He could do nothing."

Key Truths

Grit hold to the truth when people question you.

Grit grows when we keep speaking up about what Jesus has done.

Grit doesn't need all the answers to give faithful testimony.

- Where in your life do you need to speak truth like this man?
- What keeps people silent?
- Who are you most like in this story—the man, the parents, the Pharisees, or the crowd?
