SEPTUAGESIMA

Septuagesima begins the Church's gentle descent toward Lent by placing us around seventy days before Easter; an intentional echo of Israel's **seventy years of exile**, when God's people lived by promise. The name, septuagesima, isn't intended to be precise, but symbolic: it signals that we stand in the wilderness of our own captivity to sin, awaiting the deliverance that God alone can give. Fittingly, the Gospel of the Workers in the Vineyard confronts us with the scandal and comfort of **Grace Alone**, for the Master gives the same denarius to all, not according to labor but according to His grace. Septuagesima therefore teaches us that as we begin the long road toward Easter, we walk not by our merits or achievements but by the sheer, unearned grace of God. It is the first reminder that our whole journey toward Easter rests on grace from beginning to end.
