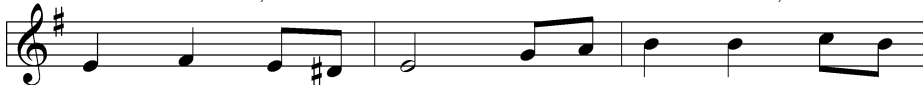

Prayer



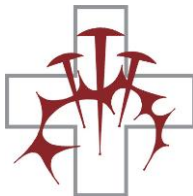

Prayer





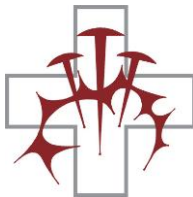

- C** Amen.

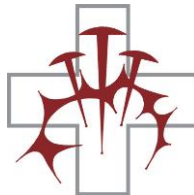

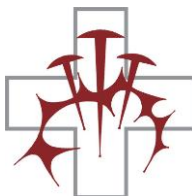
