WORSHIPPING WITH OUR CHILDREN

We get to celebrate "The Baptism of our Lord" today, when Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist. When Jesus was baptized, it marked the beginning of His mission to save the world from sin through His death on the cross and His resurrection at Easter. Because Jesus never sinned, He certainly didn't need to be baptized like we do. But because He loved us so much, He chose to be baptized with the Baptism of sinners in order to identify Himself with us who are sinners. Later on the cross, Jesus paid for all our sins, and rose again to prove it to all the world. In your Baptism, Jesus has given you all the forgiveness He earned for you on the cross. 

Silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination.


Almighty God, have mercy upon us, forgive us our sins, and lead us to everlasting life. Amen.


Absolution

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Epistle Reading

Romans 6:1-11

¹What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? ²By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? ³Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

⁵For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. ⁶We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. ⁷For one who has died has been set free from sin. ⁸Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. ⁹We know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. ¹⁰For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. ¹¹So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.





Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.






If you are not communing, but wish to come forward to receive a blessing, please fold both arms across your heart. Children are also encouraged to come forward for a blessing.


