ARLEN MEYER BANNER DESCRIPTION

The banner hanging towards the left of the chancel was and designed especially for Trinity's Sanctuary by Arlen Meyer, a teacher and artist from Seward, Nebraska. It is designed to be used for the whole season of Lent and will change slightly week by week.

The imposition of ashes creates the cross form used in the banner. It is traditionally applied with the spoken words, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." In Arlen's design the cross is placed above an open grave as a symbol of our mortality. In the depth of that grave there is a beginning indication of a thorny crown. While our sins and sinfulness are serious and lethal, the burden of our sin is carried into our grave by Christ who precedes us in death and with whom we are buried by baptism into death.
