The lessons of the Epiphany season focus on the miracles that Christ performed and through which it becomes obvious to us that this Infant in the manger is not merely a little baby, but the One who is able and willing to be with us in all our needs. With that realization, the angel trumpets focused on the manger in the Christmas portrayal are turned outward to the whole world in the Epiphany symbolism.
