

Why was Jesus baptized?

It was not because of sin (2 Cor 5:21).

Jesus got baptized as a decisive step of commitment to begin his ministry to us. He aligns himself with sinners (like us). He submits his life to the Father's plan and the Father anoints the Son with His Own Fatherly Words and with the Holy Spirit. The good news of the kingdom is coming!



How should I understand this moment?

"Heaven breaks open..." God breaks into human history; The Father sovereignly declares Jesus as His Son, while the Holy Spirit descends onto Jesus like a dove. We get to witness all three persons of the Trinity!



Why did God say "You are my son whom I love; with you I am well pleased?,,

These are OT prophetic words of the coming CHRIST you can find in the Scriptures...

PSALM 2:7-9

I will proclaim the Lord's decree: He said to me, "You are my son; today I have become your father. Ask me, and I will make the nations your inheritance, the ends of the earth your possession. "You will break them with a rod of iron; you will dash them to pieces like pottery."



ISAIAH 42:1-4

Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him, and he will bring justice to the nations. He will not shout or cry out, or raise his voice in the streets. A bruised reed he will not break, and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out. In faithfulness he will bring forth justice; he will not falter or be discouraged till he establishes justice on earth. In his teaching the islands will put their hope.



Why are Matthew and Luke's genealogies different?

The biggest reason is explained in Luke 3:23: Jesus was the son of Joseph, SO IT WAS THOUGHT. Heli was most likely the father of Mary. If Mary had no brothers, then whoever Mary married would be the heir (Joseph).



Why is Jeconiah a big deal?

This is what the Lord says: "Record this man as if childless, a man who will not prosper in his lifetime, for none of his offspring will prosper, none will sit on the throne of David or rule anymore in Judah." (Jeremiah 22:30, NIV)

SOJESUS IS THE ONLY ONE WHO COULD BE THE RIGHTFUL HEIR, THE FINAL KING OF DAVID, THE ONE WHO RULES FOREVER. IT SUFFICES TO SAY THAT JESUS IS QUALIFIED.





Why did Luke go all the way back to Adam (Matthew starts at Abraham)?
Luke is showing that the gospel, the

Savior, is available to all humanity.

1 CORINTHIANS 15:47-49

"The first man was of the dust of the earth; the second man is of heaven. As was the earthly man, so are those who are of the earth; and as is the heavenly man, so also are those who are of heaven. 
