August 8, 2021 1 Corinthians 14:1-25: Chase After Gifts That Will Bless Others!

γλῶσσα: (usually translated tongue)

- 1. The physical muscle in your mouth.
- 2. Things we might say.
- 3. Language
- 4. Prayer or praise directed towards God, generally not understood by the speaker.

After He took Him aside, away from the crowd, Jesus put His fingers into the man's ears. Then He spit and touched the man's **tongue**. (Mark 16:33)

So he called to him, "Father Abraham, have pity on me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my **tongue**, because I am in agony in this fire." (Luke 16:24)

People gnawed their <u>tongues</u> in agony and cursed the God of heaven because of their pains and their sores, but they refused to repent of what they had done. (Revelation 16:11)

2. Things we might say:

Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth. (1 John 3:18)

Those who consider themselves religious and yet do not keep a tight rein on their tongues deceive themselves, and their religion is worthless. (James 1:26)

3. Language

And they sang a new song, saying: "You are worthy to take the scroll and to open its seals, because you were slain, and with your blood you purchased for God persons from every tribe and language and people and nation. (Revelation 5:9)

All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. (Acts 2:4)

4. Prayer or praise directed towards God, generally not understood by the speaker.

For anyone who speaks in a tongue does not speak to people but to God. Indeed, no one understands them; they utter mysteries by the Spirit. (1 Corinthians 14:2)

For if I pray in a tongue, my spirit prays, but my mind is unfruitful. (1 Corinthians 14:14)

Follow the way of love and eagerly desire gifts of the Spirit, especially prophecy. (1 Corinthians 14:1)

Look for ways to serve another.

Not with words or speech but in actions and truth.
