How did Paul explain the Lord's Supper?

This is my body (1 Corinthians 11:24)

- 1. Transubstantiation (Catholic): bread and wine literally changed into the body and blood of Christ.
- 2. Consubstantiation (Luther): Unchanged substance of bread/wine is united with the substance of body/blood of Christ.
- 3. A mere remembrance (Zingli/Baptist): "Do this in remembrance of me."
- 4. Spiritual Presence (Calvin, Presbyterian): Jesus is present spiritually.

(27-32)

What is the unworthy manner in Corinth? How about today?

(33-34)

What is Paul's practical advice?

4 Things to do at the "love feast" to remember and honor Jesus!

- 1. We should look back... at what Christ did for us!
- 2. We should **look forward** to His promises.

"Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in Me. My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? (John 14:1-2)

- 3. We should **look within** at an unworthy sinner saved by grace, repent and be thankful.
- 4. We should **look around** at my brothers and sisters in Christ. Am I loving them?
