

Nehemiah 1: Humble Prayer

Verses: 1-3

Brother, how are our fellow Jews doing in Jerusalem?

They are in disgrace... they are dealing with great troubles... The walls around the city that were rebuilt have been torn down by those wishing to do them harm... the gates have been burned by fire from surrounding tribes and enemies... they are not doing well at all.

Who is this Nehemiah? And what is the historical book of Nehemiah all about...





So, Nehemiah gets bad news about how things are going... So what does Ezra do?

Verses 4-11

How do I pray?

A - Adoration

C - Confession

T - Thanksgiving

S – Supplication

A: Look at verse 4-5 again... Do you hear Nehemiah worshipping (or adoring) God's faithfulness, strength, love, awesomeness? Your times of coming to prayer should include this sort of worship and adoration.

C: Look at verses 6-7 again... God, we are sinners as a group, my family are sinners, I got sin issues. Lord, we need your mercy.

T: Look at verses 8-10 again... Lord thank you for your covenant to bring us back to this place. We thank you for giving us this dwelling place.

S: Supplication - Latin for humble pleading. Praying for others and/or yourself. Lord, hear my prayer, give me favor, heal, help.

C: Read Psalm 51:1-5. Talk about the confession of sin you hear from King David.
