Philippians 4 NIV

4 Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! 5 Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. 6 Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. 7 And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

We should keep in mind that Paul wrote these words from a Roman prison either in Rome or Ephesus. The Apostle did not write these words in response to a crisis, as he did with Galatians and Colossians. Instead, he wrote to express his appreciation and affection for the Philippian believers.

Rejoice in the Lord Always

- This is a clear instruction from God's Word...

- If Paul the Apostle can write these words from a Prison Cell and Rejoice so can we...
- There is an imperative here "Rejoice in the Lord Always, again I will say Rejoice"...
- Our Rejoicing should not be subject purely upon our conditions but your Lord...
- Rejoice in Him...
- There is a calling not to look simply at our circumstances but to have faith in God and our faith should affect our attitude...

Jeremiah 22

6 For this is what the Lord says about the palace of the king of Judah:

"Though you are like Gilead to me, like the summit of Lebanon, I will surely make you like a wasteland, like towns not inhabited.

Vs 8 "People from many nations will pass by this city and will ask one another, 'Why has the Lord done such a thing to this great city?' 9 And the answer will be: 'Because they have forsaken the covenant of the Lord their God and have worshiped and served other gods.'"

Vs. 6

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition,

Right now there is a lot Anxiousness in the world...

Don't be Anxious...

Anxious: Careful, Thoughtful: Comes from the Root Word - Anxiety: to be drawn in different directions.

John 14

"Let not your heart be troubled; you believe in God, believe also in Me. 2 In My Father's house are many mansions; if *it were* not *so,* I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. 3 And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, *there* you may be also.

The disciples seemed to have reason to be troubled. Jesus had just told them, one of them was a traitor, that all of them would deny Him, and that He would leave them that night. All of this would legitimately trouble the disciples, yet Jesus told them, **let not your heart be troubled**.

Then he says in Vs. 1 "Let not your hearts be troubled"

- Jesus never promised a life without trouble,
- He did promise we can have an untroubled heart even in troubling times.

This was, in a sense, a command. "The form of the imperative here implies that they should "stop being troubled."
In other words; "Set your heart at ease"

Matthew 6:34

Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.

In Every Situation Pray and Petition with Thanksgiving

Vs. 6

but in every situation, by **prayer and petition**, with **thanksgiving**, present your requests to God.

o "Don't Skip Thanksgiving"

- Before Jesus Feeds the Five Thousand

Matthew 14:19

...he gave thanks and broke the loaves. Then he gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the people.

- Before Jesus Feeds the Four Thousand

Matthew 15:36

36 Then he took the seven loaves and the fish, and **when he had given thanks**, he broke them and gave them to the disciples, and they in turn to the people. **37** They all ate and were satisfied.

- At the Last Supper before the Cross

Matthew 26:26,27

Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is my body."

27 Then he took a cup, and **when he had given thanks**, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you.

- When there wasn't enough, Jesus gave Thanks and there was Enough...
- When they needed a Miracle, Jesus gave thanks and there was a Miracle...
- Before Jesus layed down his life as a Sacrifice, he gave thanks, and becomes the lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.

John 14:27

Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

The word Jesus probably used here was Shalom

Shalom:

- a key word and image for salvation in the Bible.
- refers to a person being uninjured and safe, whole and sound.
- reconciliation of all things to God through the work of Christ
- complete well-being physical, psychological, social, and spiritual
- · peace with others, peace between parties.
- peace within
- a state of national tranquillity
