Psalm 127 is titled A Song of Ascents of Solomon. Most believe Solomon to be the author, yet it is possible that the psalm was composed by David for Solomon.

A Psalm of Ascent was written for the Jewish people to recite as they made their way on Pilgrimage up to Jerusalem to attend annual festivals in the Temple.

The Psalmist says:

Vs. 1

Unless the LORD builds the house, it's builders labor in vain.

Solomon understood that the work of man had its place, but it was of little use without the work and blessing of God. Without God's work and blessing, they labor in vain who build it.

1. A Builder has a Plan

Acts 9

Meanwhile, Saul was still breathing out murderous threats against the Lord's disciples. "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting," he replied. 6 "Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do."

Paul Tells of this account to King Agrippa:

Acts 26

13 About noon, King Agrippa, as I was on the road, I saw a light from heaven, brighter than the sun, blazing around me and my companions.

14 We all fell to the ground, and I heard a voice saying to me in Aramaic, 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me? It is hard for you to kick against the goads.'

15 "Then I asked, 'Who are you, Lord?'

"I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting,' the Lord replied. 16 'Now get up and stand on your feet. I have appeared to you to appoint you as a servant and as a witness of what you have seen and will see of me. 17 I will rescue you from your own people and from the Gentiles. I am sending you to them 18 to open their eyes and turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan to God, so that they may receive forgiveness of sins and a place among those who are sanctified by faith in me.'

The Lord said to Paul - I have appeared to you to appoint you

- · He sees and takes note...
- So be diligent in prayer...
- · Remain steadfast in your faith...
- Things will shift by the working of the Holy Spirit...
- · God's plan will take you past your own ability...
