A Message from our Pastor

The most significant issue facing the world is sin. Scripture shows us that sin is the problem, and Jesus is the answer. The church of Jesus is keenly aware of this doctrinal truth. Yet, so many times we fail to be what God has called us to be and to do what God has called us to do. Over my thirty years of ministry, I have come to realize that while sin is the most significant problem of the world, **a**

diminished view of God is the most significant problem in the church. A low view of God is usually accompanied by a high view of self. This manifests itself in several ways. I have seen churches that clearly knew the will of God for the future of His local church but failed to act because of a lack of faith: For example, failure to begin a program or expand facilities because of concern over resources or financial obligation. (These churches had plenty of resources and finances.) I have also seen churches that were content with staying small because many of the members did not want to lose their control and positions of authority in the church because it gave them a feeling of importance and power. All of this failure to act can be attributed to a diminished view of God and an elevated view of self.

May it never be said that ENBC has a view of God that is anything less than Scripture presents Him. God has called us to serve Him in ways that are far beyond our ability. God has called ENBC to accomplish great things that we can't do without a powerful and almighty God. How do we maintain a proper perspective of God? How are we to understand our own position before a Holy God? We must study the Scriptures to see God in all His glory. We must spend time with Him daily to regularly be reminded that we were created to live in dependence upon the Supreme God! Isaiah reminded the people of God who were going through very discouraging circumstances to look at God in times of trouble. *"Go on up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good news; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good news; lift it up, fear not; say to the cities of Judah, 'Behold your God!'"* (Isaiah 40:9) Let us keep God in the proper place in our hearts and join John the Baptist as we decrease so that He can increase!
