## Warming Up (Discussion Starters, icebreakers, transitions)

- What's one message or value you think our culture constantly tries to push on us?
  - How do you see that value influencing people you know (or even yourself)?
- Have you ever felt pressure to either totally withdraw from culture or just blend into it?
  - What did you do in that moment, and what would you do differently now?

## **Digging Deeper**

- What distressed Paul about Athens in **Acts 17**, and how did he respond?
  - What does Paul's response teach us about how Christians should engage with culture today?
- In 1 Corinthians 1:18–31, how does Paul turn the idea of "honor" upside down?
  - O How is this radically different from the honor/shame system in Corinth (and in our world)?
- What does 1 Corinthians 9:19–23 reveal about Paul's approach to different people and perspectives?
  - What would it look like for us to become "all things to all people" in our own communities?
- In what ways do modern culture and ancient Corinth share similar values around identity, sexuality, and public recognition?
- How might understanding these cultural pressures help us respond more wisely as believers?
- How does a Christian worldview answer the four ultimate questions: Origin, Meaning, Morality, Destiny?
  - Which of those four questions is most often misunderstood or challenged today? Why?

## **Bringing It Home**

- What would it look like for you to engage culture like Paul (with compassion, truth, and wisdom?)
  - What's one situation this week where you might live out that kind of engagement?
    - Can you put yourself there?
- In what ways are you tempted to withdraw or acquiesce?
  - What truths from Scripture can help you stay rooted and courageous in those moments?
