## **Digging Deeper**

Esau "sold the farm" for a bowl of stew. He lost his "birthright". Has there been a time when your emotions got the better of you and led to a costly decision?

Edom was in a place where they felt indestructible and yet it was an illusion of security. On what "rock-like" structures might you be basing your security.

**Read Hebrews 12:4-17**. The author makes a reference to Esau's godlessness. What does this have to do with a God who disciplines us?

The sin of pride is a huge problem for apprentices of Jesus. Many times a prideful person can't see their own pride. What role does "community" play in helping get this weed out by its root?

Our pride can be revealed when we are presented with a need that might cost us something—a few extra dollars...late for an appointment...losing our spot in line—or maybe even put us in a place of great discomfort. (these are rather minor) How do you typically respond when you see a need?

How do you respond when disaster befalls someone you know?
