God Revealed Through Scripture

Hebrews 1:1-3 (NIV) “In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and in various ways, ²but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom also he made the universe. ³The Son is the radiance of God’s glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word.”

1. God is revealed through His name in scripture.

Psalms 19:7-9 (NIV) “The law of the LORD...”

Matthew 26:27b-28a (NIV) “Drink from it, all of you. ²⁸This is my blood of the covenant...”

How is God revealed through Scripture?

2. God is revealed through His laws in scripture.

Genesis 2:17 (NIV) “You must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat from it you will certainly die.”

Matthew 22:37-40 (NIV) “‘Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.’ ³⁸This is the first and greatest commandment. ³⁹And the second is like it: ‘Love your neighbor as yourself.’ ⁴⁰All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments.”

Psalms 19:7-9 (NIV) “The law of the LORD is perfect, refreshing the soul. The statutes of the LORD are trustworthy, making wise the simple. ⁸The precepts of the LORD are right, giving joy to the heart. The commands of the LORD are radiant, giving light to the eyes. ⁹The fear of the LORD is pure, enduring forever. The decrees of the LORD are firm, and all of them are righteous.”

3. God is revealed through His transforming power in scripture.

Psalms 19:10-11 (NIV) “They are more precious than gold, than much pure gold; they are sweeter than honey, than honey from the honeycomb. ¹¹By them your servant is warned; in keeping them there is great reward.”

Matthew 4:4 (NIV) “Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.”

1 Peter 1:23 (NIV) “For you have been born again... through the living and enduring word of God.”

4. God is revealed through His strength and stability in scripture.

Psalms 19:12-14 (NIV) “But who can discern their own errors? Forgive my hidden faults. ¹³Keep your servant also from willful sins; may they not rule over me. Then I will be blameless, innocent of great transgression. ¹⁴May these words of my mouth and this meditation of my heart be pleasing in your sight, LORD, my Rock and my Redeemer.”

Deuteronomy 32:46-47 (NIV) “Take to heart all the words I have solemnly declared to you this day, so that you may command your children to obey carefully all the words of this law. ⁴⁷They are not just idle words for you—they are your life.”
