What is the purpose of being the salt and light of the world?

God calls you to become a miracle for someone else.

There are people you meet out there not by **accident**. God puts them across your path on **purpose** so you can be the answer to their prayers and you can be their miracle.

IV. REACH OUT WITH

Studies have shown that a new convert will stay in a care group and church only if:

- He is followed through with friendly, warm personal contact within the first 24 hours.
- He is visited at home or at work within the first 7 days.
- He can make 2 new friends within the first 2 weeks of coming to a Christian gathering. So introduce friends to them.
- He is assisted to attend Care Group and church for 7 weeks. Only then will he come by himself. Go the extra mile and provide the transport.
- He receives the Word. Make sure he goes through the Kingdom Series.

Look for people in all the services.

Greet, Sit, Eat – with someone new in church, especially non-believers. Introduce friends to them.

Adventure this week:

1. Memorize Psa 66:5 and write the verse from memory here:
2. Join the Matthew Team and reach out to make friends with new people in church and people that appear lonely. See your Zone Pastor to sign up for the Matthew Team.
3. Make a list of 7 people in need:Crisis - sickness, examination, financial problem
Changes and adjustments - new job, new home, new baby, new school divorce
Stress - finance, boss, work, projects and assignments

4. Pray daily for them.

Pray for opportunities to share Jesus' love.

Seek to be a miracle unto others and experience a miracle yourself!

Invite them for special events: sports, parties, etc.

Pray for the right **opening** to share the Five Blessings of the Cross and your personal testimony.

Never give up! If the first attempt fails, follow up with another creative and innovative way of sharing Christ.

Keep in touch. Keep calling or visiting him and inviting him for various meetings of the church.

Circumstances may be more conducive for your friends to be receptive sometime later.

Reach out to the 'highways and by-ways'.

5. Care for the people that you have reached.

Call, visit, introduce friends to them, bring them to care group, make sure they receive the Word.

Welcome them in church - greet, sit, eat.

Today's Articles Sharing your Testimony

It is a **personal** story of how you came to know Christ and what He has done in your life.

A good testimony should be:

Positive

Focus more on the **goodness** of God and not on how bad your past was.

Concise

Do not add in unnecessary technical or medical terms.

Christ-centred

Focus on what Christ has done.

Share a five-minute testimony:

What was your life like **BEFORE** you believed? (1 minute)

For example, your pains and disappointments, fears, etc.

What **MOVED** you to receive Christ? (2 minutes)

How were you blessed **AFTER** you believed? (2 minutes)

Planning Effective House Parties

Christmas, Easter, Birthdays, Anniversaries, New Year, Thanksgiving, etc., are great occasions to shine!

Keep it small, perhaps only 15. Get two or three believing friends to plan with you. Draw up a guest list: close friends, colleagues, relatives.

VERY IMPORTANT: Tell the Christians ahead of time about their roles so that they will not just chit chat among themselves. Pray fervently.

Keep the refreshments **simple**. You do not want to spend too much time in the kitchen, <u>neglecting prayer</u> and **hospitality**. The key is to have a **personal** touch. It is better to have the refreshments after the message. **Pray** with **expectation** before the meeting.

Plan to avoid **distractions**: Get people to babysit. Remove the receiver from the **phone**. Seat the people properly during the sharing time so that they can see and hear the one sharing.

Get one or two to share **personal <u>testimonies</u>**. Each testimony should not be more than five minutes. Each person may focus on one of the Five Blessings of the Cross.

Get someone to share the FIVE BLESSINGS OF THE CROSS.

If appropriate, ask for a response. Lead the person to receive Christ:

"Dear Heavenly Father, thank you for sending Jesus Christ to die for me. I receive Jesus into my life and thank you that because of what Christ did, I have complete forgiveness of all my sins. Help me to know you more and more each day. Amen"

End **early** to allow enough time for interaction between Christians and non-Christians. This is the time to share more about Christ.

Who is Jesus?

The Bible tells us that Jesus is BOTH GOD and MAN at one time.

Many cults deny either the fact of Christ's divinity or humanity.

1. Jesus is fully man

Heb 4:14-15

Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has gone through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. ¹⁵For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are -- yet was without sin *NIV*

1 John 4:1-3

¹Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, because many false prophets have gone out into the world. ²This is how you can recognize the Spirit of God: Every spirit that acknowledges that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God. *NIV*

He is the perfect man

Humanity at its fullest and best. Man as man should be.

Why is the humanity of Jesus important?

Because He is a man, He is qualified to die for us. A chicken or even a donkey cannot represent man and be our sacrifice.

The manhood of Jesus puts Him on our level. He experienced suffering, weariness, temptation just as we do. Therefore He understands and feels with us in our trials and difficulties.

He was born miraculously

He was born of a virgin.

Matt 1:23 "The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel"-which means. "God with us." *NIV*

Jesus' 'gene' is from God – not a human father.

He is sinless

1 Peter 2:22 He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth. NIV

2. Jesus Christ is God

John 20:27-29

Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe." ²⁸Thomas said to him, "My Lord and my God!" ²⁹Then Jesus told him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." *NIV*

He is the Son of God

John 3:16

For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. *NKJV*

How could God have a son?

The word "son" in the Scriptures is sometimes used literally: i.e. biological sonship. eq. James is the son of Zebedee.

But the word "son" is also used figuratively, i.e. to describe nature, character. Hence, when the Bible says: "John is the son of thunder", it tells us that John's nature is very violent, hot tempered and easily aroused.

In the same way, when we say that "Jesus is the SON of GOD" we are saying that Jesus has the very nature, character of God.

Note the term: "Only begotten". The Greek word, "monogenes" comes from two words *mono* and *genes*. Mono means: "same, one and only." Genes means: "kind or variety." Here is where we get our English word "gene".

Hence, the word monogenes means that Jesus is the only one on earth with the genes (nature, character) of God.

Col 1:16-17

For by him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things were created by him and for him. 17 He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. NIV

Jesus Christ holds all things by His power.

Jesus works supernatural miracles.

Matt 8:27

The men were amazed and asked, "What kind of man is this? Even the winds and the waves obey him!" *NIV*

John 11:38-44

Lazarus was raised from death.

Jesus rose from the dead

1 Cor 15:5-8

 \dots and that he appeared to Peter, and then to the Twelve. ⁶After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. ⁷Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, ⁸and last of all he appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born. *NIV*

3. Jesus Christ Himself claims He is God

John 10:30-33

I and the Father are one." 31 Again the Jews picked up stones to stone him, 32 but Jesus said to them, "I have shown you many great miracles from the Father. For which of these do you stone me?" 33 "We are not stoning you for any of these," replied the Jews, "but for blasphemy, because you, a mere man, claim to be God." NIV

John 8:58

"I tell you the truth," Jesus answered, "before Abraham was born, I am!" NIV

Many people are ready to accept Jesus as merely a great moral teacher. This is not a possible choice. Why?

A man who says the sort of things Jesus claims and promises is either a liar and lunatic or is really what he claims to be - God!

Someone who lived, **taught**, **impacted** lives and **resurrected** as Jesus did, can such a person be a lunatic? Can he be a liar?

It would take more than a Jesus to invent a Jesus. Jesus is indeed what He claims to be!
