# Matthew 26

<sup>31</sup> Then Jesus said to them, “Tonight all of you will fall away because of me, for it is written: I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep of the flock will be scattered. <sup>32</sup> But after I have risen, I will go ahead of you to Galilee.” <sup>33</sup> Peter told him, “Even if everyone falls away because of you, I will never fall away.”





# Matthew 26

34 “Truly I tell you,” Jesus said to him, “tonight, before the rooster crows, you will deny me three times.” 35 “Even if I have to die with you,” Peter told him, “I will never deny you,” and all the disciples said the same thing.





## Luke 22

<sup>54</sup> They seized him, led him away, and brought him into the high priest's house. Meanwhile Peter was following at a distance. <sup>55</sup> They lit a fire in the middle of the courtyard and sat down together, and Peter sat among them. <sup>56</sup> When a servant saw him sitting in the light, and looked closely at him, she said, "This man was with him too." <sup>57</sup> But he denied it: "Woman, I don't know him."







## Luke 22

<sup>58</sup> After a little while, someone else saw him and said, “You’re one of them too.” “Man, I am not!” Peter said. <sup>59</sup> About an hour later, another kept insisting, “This man was certainly with him, since he’s also a Galilean.” <sup>60</sup> But Peter said, “Man, I don’t know what you’re talking about!”





## Luke 22

Immediately, while he was still speaking, a rooster crowed. <sup>61</sup> Then the Lord turned and looked at Peter. So Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said to him, “Before the rooster crows today, you will deny me three times.” <sup>62</sup> And he went outside and wept bitterly.





# John 21

<sup>1</sup> After this, Jesus revealed himself again to his disciples by the Sea of Tiberias. He revealed himself in this way: <sup>2</sup> Simon Peter, Thomas (called “Twin”), Nathanael from Cana of Galilee, Zebedee’s sons, and two others of his disciples were together. <sup>3</sup> “I’m going fishing,” Simon Peter said to them. “We’re coming with you,” they told him. They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.







## John 21

<sup>4</sup> When daybreak came, Jesus stood on the shore, but the disciples did not know it was Jesus. <sup>5</sup> “Friends,” Jesus called to them, “you don’t have any fish, do you?” “No,” they answered. <sup>6</sup> “Cast the net on the right side of the boat,” he told them, “and you’ll find some.” So they did, and they were unable to haul it in because of the large number of fish.





## John 21

<sup>7</sup> The disciple, the one Jesus loved, said to Peter, “It is the Lord!” When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tied his outer clothing around him (for he had taken it off) and plunged into the sea. <sup>8</sup> Since they were not far from land (about a hundred yards, away), the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish.







## John 21

<sup>9</sup> When they got out on land, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish lying on it, and bread.

<sup>10</sup> “Bring some of the fish you’ve just caught,” Jesus told them. <sup>11</sup> So Simon Peter climbed up and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish — 153 of them. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn.





# John 21

<sup>12</sup> “Come and have breakfast,” Jesus told them. None of the disciples dared ask him, “Who are you?” because they knew it was the Lord.

<sup>13</sup> Jesus came, took the bread, and gave it to them. He did the same with the fish. <sup>14</sup> This was now the third time Jesus appeared, to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

<sup>15</sup> When they had eaten breakfast, Jesus asked Simon Peter, “Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?” “Yes, Lord,” he said to him, “you know that I love you.” “Feed my lambs,” he told him. <sup>16</sup> A second time he asked him, “Simon, son of John, do you love me?” “Yes, Lord,” he said to him, “you know that I love you.” “Shepherd my sheep,” he told him.
