











Acts 20:1-38 PAUL IN MACEDONIA

¹After the uproar was over, Paul sent for the disciples, encouraged them, and after saying farewell, departed to go to Macedonia. ²And when he had passed through those areas and offered them many words of encouragement, he came to Greece ³and stayed three months.

...The Jews plotted against him when he was about to set sail for Syria, and so he decided to go back through Macedonia. ⁴He was accompanied by Sopater son of Pyrrhus from Berea, Aristarchus and Secundus from Thessalonica, Gaius from Derbe, Timothy, and Tychicus and Trophimus from the province of Asia. 5These men went on ahead and waited for us in Troas, ⁶but we sailed away from Philippi after the Festival of Unleavened Bread. In five days we reached them at Troas, where we spent seven days.

Acts 20:1-38 EUTYCHUS REVIVED AT TROAS

⁷On the first day of the week, we assembled to break bread. Paul spoke to them, and since he was about to depart the next day, he kept on talking until midnight. 8There were many lamps in the room upstairs where we were assembled, 9 and a young man named Eutychus was sitting on a window sill and sank into a deep sleep as Paul kept on talking. When he was overcome by sleep, he fell down from the third story and was picked up dead. 10 But Paul went down, bent over him, embraced him, and said, "Don't be alarmed, because he's alive." 11 After going upstairs, breaking the bread, and eating, Paul talked a long time until dawn. Then he left. 12They brought the boy home alive and were greatly comforted. UNSTOPPABLE

EUTYCHUS

- Only person that God used Paul to raise from the dead. (Jesus & Peter)
- Shows Paul as a prophet in the vein of Elijah and Elisha. Word givers.
- Powerful validation of Paul's message and ministry by God.

Acts 20:1-38 FROM TROAS TO MILETUS

13We went on ahead to the ship and sailed for Assos, where we were going to take Paul on board, because these were his instructions, since he himself was going by land. 14When he met us at Assos, we took him on board and went on to Mitylene. 15 Sailing from there, the next day we arrived off Chios. The following day we crossed over to Samos, and the day after, we came to Miletus.



¹⁶For Paul had decided to sail past Ephesus to avoid spending time in the province of Asia, because he was hurrying to be in Jerusalem, if possible, for the day of Pentecost. ¹⁷Now from Miletus, he sent to Ephesus and summoned the elders of the church.





Acts 20:1-38 FAREWELL ADDRESS TO THE EPHESIAN ELDERS

18When they came to him, he said to them, "You know, from the first day I set foot in Asia, how I was with you the whole time, ¹⁹serving the Lord with all humility, with tears, and during the trials that came to me through the plots of the Jews. ²⁰You know that I did not hesitate to proclaim anything to you that was profitable and to teach you publicly and from house to house. 21 testified to both Jews and Greeks about repentance toward God and faith in our Lord Jesus.

²² And now I am on my way to Jerusalem, compelled by the Spirit, not knowing what I will encounter there, ²³except that in every town the Holy Spirit warns me that chains and afflictions are waiting for me. ²⁴But I consider my life of no value to myself; my purpose is to finish my course and the ministry I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify to the gospel of God's grace.

²⁵"And now I know that none of you, among whom I went about preaching the kingdom, will ever see me again. ²⁶Therefore I declare to you this day that I am innocent of the blood of all of you, ²⁷because I did not avoid declaring to you the whole plan of God.




