¹After this, he left Athens and went to Corinth, ²where he found a Jew named Aquila, a native of Pontus, who had recently come from Italy with his wife Priscilla because Claudius had ordered all the Jews to leave Rome. Paul came to them, ³and since they were of the same occupation, tentmakers by trade, he stayed with them and worked. ⁴He reasoned in the synagogue every Sabbath and tried to persuade both Jews and Greeks. 5When Silas and Timothy arrived from Macedonia, Paul devoted himself to preaching the word and testified to the Jews that Jesus is the Messiah.



⁶When they resisted and blasphemed, he shook out his clothes and told them, "Your blood is on your own heads! I am innocent. From now on I will go to the Gentiles." 7So he left there and went to the house of a man named Titius Justus, a worshiper of God, whose house was next door to the synagogue. 8Crispus, the leader of the synagogue, believed in the Lord, along with his whole household. Many of the Corinthians, when they heard, believed and were baptized.



⁹The Lord said to Paul in a night vision, "Don't be afraid, but keep on speaking and don't be silent. ¹⁰For Lam with you, and no one will lay a hand on you to hurt you, because I have many people in this city." ¹¹He stayed there a year and a half, teaching the word of God among them.

¹⁴As Paul was about to open his mouth, Gallio said to the Jews, "If it were a matter of wrongdoing or of a serious crime, it would be reasonable for me to put up with you Jews. 15 But if these are questions about words, names, and your own law, see to it yourselves. I refuse to be a judge of such things." 16So he drove them from the tribunal. 17And they all seized Sosthenes, the leader of the synagogue, and beat him in front of the tribunal, but none of these things mattered to Gallio.

¹⁸After staying for some time, Paul said farewell to the brothers and sisters and sailed away to Syria, accompanied by Priscilla and Aquila. He shaved his head at Cenchreae because of a vow he had taken. ¹⁹When they reached Ephesus he left them there, but he himself entered the synagogue and debated with the Jews. ²⁰When they asked him to stay for a longer time, he declined, 21 but he said farewell and added, "I'll come back to you again, if God wills." Then he set sail from Ephesus.

²²On landing at Caesarea, he went up to Jerusalem and greeted the church, then went down to Antioch.

¹When I came to you, brothers and sisters, announcing the mystery of God to you, I did not come with brilliance of speech or wisdom. 21 decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. 3I came to you in weakness, in fear, and in much trembling. 4My speech and my preaching were not with persuasive words of wisdom but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, 5so that your faith might not be based on human wisdom but on God's power.
