

⁴⁵Therefore, many of the Jews who came to Mary and saw what he did believed in him. ⁴⁶But some of them went to the Pharisees and told them what Jesus had done.

⁴⁷So the chief priests and the Pharisees convened the Sanhedrin and were saying, "What are we going to do since this man is doing many signs? ⁴⁸If we let him go on like this, everyone will believe in him, and the Romans will come and take away both our place and our nation."

⁴⁹One of them, Caiaphas, who was high priest that year, said to them, "You know nothing at all! ⁵⁰You're not considering that it is to your advantage that one man should die for the people rather than the whole nation perish." 51He did not say this on his own, but being high priest that year he prophesied that Jesus was going to die for the nation, 52 and not for the nation only, but also to unite the scattered children of God. 53So from that day on they plotted to kill him.

⁵⁴Jesus therefore no longer walked openly among the Jews but departed from there to the countryside near the wilderness, to a town called Ephraim, and he stayed there with the disciples.

²³Jesus replied to them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴Truly I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains by itself.
