

# A Message From God's Word

## Ephesians 2:11-12



We want to take God's Word  
and view the times through it,  
not view the Word through  
the times.





The modern nation state of  
Israel is not biblical Israel,  
meaning it is not the heir of  
God's promise to ancient  
Israel.








Biblical Israel was a theocratic  
monarchy in covenant with  
God, a covenant centered on  
the Torah, the Law of Moses.  
Modern Israel claims to be a  
secular liberal democracy.



God never blesses people simply so they can hoard it to themselves, so they can have privileged status with God or before others. God blesses people so that through them God can bless others.



This NEW covenant would be like the covenant through Moses in that it would fulfill the promises to Abraham: it would not be conditional on Israel's obedience, but it would be based solely on God's love and faithfulness.
