# The Five Pillars


- **The confession of faith** : "There is no god but Allah, and Muhammad is the messenger (apostle) of Allah".
- **Prayer** : The prescribed ritual prayers five times daily, at prescribed times, with the prescribed posture, have to be observed. During these five prayers a fixed prayer-text must be recited seventeen times altogether (twice in the morning; four times at noon; four times in the afternoon; three times in the evening and four times at night).
- **The giving of alms**: A religious duty and should amount to not less than 2.5% of the income above ones needs.
- **Keeping the Fast during the month of Ramadan**: The fast is to last from the rising of the sun until sunset.
- **Pilgrimage to Mecca (Hajj)**: Required once in a lifetime during the month of Ramadan.

# Muhammad

- Born into the powerful Quraysh tribe in Mecca 570 A.D.
- Married a wealthy widow Khadija 15 years his senior.
- In 610 A.D. (at 40) Muhammad receives his calling from the angel Gabriel.

# Muhammad

- Muhammad was deathly afraid of the source of his revelation.
- At first he thought it came from a jinn. Khadija convinced him it was from God.
- After a three year period of silence the messages began to come again.
- Hijra (622, flight), Battle of Badr, Battle of Uhud, the siege of Medina, then Mecca falls.



# Key Terms

## Allah

The Supreme Creator of the universe and all that exists, whom all Muslims worship. The word Allah is derived from the Arabic word *Ilah* (meaning god), but as the word 'god' has a plural form (gods) and a feminine form (goddess), the word Allah should always be used in its place.

## Fatwa

A legal verdict or opinion given by one or more people well-versed in Islamic law, i.e. a cleric or scholar. It is NOT obligatory to follow a fatwa, as this is merely an opinion.

# Key Terms

## **Hajj**

The fifth pillar of Islam, Hajj is the pilgrimage to Mecca which every Muslim must take once in their lifetime, but only if they are healthy enough and able to afford it.

## **Hijab**

The required Islamic dress code for women, in which the body is covered so that only the face and hands are exposed.

# Key Terms

## **Imam**

The leader of any congregational prayer. It is also sometimes used to refer to the head of an Islamic state.

## **Insha' Allah**

If Allah wills.

## **Isa (AS)**

Jesus, one of the greatest of all prophets. It was to Isa (AS) that the Injeel (Gospels) were revealed.

## **Islam**

Derived from the word Salam (Peace), Islam literally means 'Peace through submission to Allah'.

# Key Terms

## Jihad

Literally means to struggle or strive, and is often incorrectly interpreted as 'holy war'. In an Islamic sense, Jihad is the struggle to propagate or preserve Islam.

## Ka'bah

The structure in Mecca to which all Muslims turn to whilst praying. It was originally built by Adam (AS), then subsequently rebuilt by Ibrahim (AS) and Ismail (AS), then finally cleansed by Muhammad (SAW) and his followers after the pagans of Mecca had used it for their idol-worship for hundreds of years.

# Key Terms

## **Qur'an**

The final divine revelation sent to mankind via Muhammad (SAW). The word Qur'an literally means 'repeatedly recited'.

## **Ramadan**

The ninth month of the Hijri calendar. It was during this month that the revelation of the Qur'an began, and the bloodless conquest of Mecca occurred.

# Key Terms

## **Shariah**

Islamic law, derived from the Qur'an & Sunnah. The Shariah is final and absolute, and cannot be changed.

## **Sunnah**

The sayings, practices and living habits of the Prophet Muhammad (SAW), as recording in the various hadith collections. Along with the Qur'an, the sunnah is a source of Islamic law and practice.

## **Surah / Surat**

A chapter of the Qur'an, of which there are 114.

# Key Terms

## **Tawhid**

The belief in the absolute uniqueness of Allah, His attributes and His actions, with no equals or associates. In short, this is the very fundamental concept of Islam.

# God/Allah

- **God** - The central doctrine of Islam is that God is one and that no partner is to be associated with him. To associate a partner with God is to commit the sin of *shirk*, or blasphemy, for which the Qur'an offers no forgiveness (Surah 4:48). Obviously, the doctrine of the Trinity is offensive to Muslims.

# Original Forgiveness

Surah 2:37-Then Adam received from his Lord [some] words, and He accepted his repentance. Indeed, it is He who is the Accepting of repentance, the Merciful.

# Mankind is Created Innocent

Surah 30:30-So direct your face toward the religion, inclining to truth. [Adhere to] the fitrah of Allah upon which He has created [all] people. No change should there be in the creation of Allah . That is the correct religion, but most of the people do not know.

# Personal Responsibility for Sin

Surah 6:163-164 - No partner has He. And this I have been commanded, and I am the first [among you] of the Muslims. Say, "Is it other than Allah I should desire as a lord while He is the Lord of all things? And every soul earns not [blame] except against itself, and no bearer of burdens will bear the burden of another. Then to your Lord is your return, and He will inform you concerning that over which you used to differ."

# Blood Sacrifice is not Desired

Surah 22:37-Their meat will not reach Allah , nor will their blood, but what reaches Him is piety from you. Thus have We subjected them to you that you may glorify Allah for that [to] which He has guided you; and give good tidings to the doers of good.

# Jews did not kill Jesus

Surah 4:156-157 - And [We cursed them] for their disbelief and their saying against Mary a great slander, and [for] their saying, "Indeed, we have killed the Messiah, Jesus, the son of Mary, the messenger of Allah ." And they did not kill him, nor did they crucify him; but [another] was made to resemble him to them. And indeed, those who differ over it are in doubt about it. They have no knowledge of it except the following of assumption. And they did not kill him, for certain.

# Forgiveness for All Who Repent

Surah 39:53-54 - Say, "O My servants who have transgressed against themselves [by sinning], do not despair of the mercy of Allah . Indeed, Allah forgives all sins. Indeed, it is He who is the Forgiving, the Merciful." And return [in repentance] to your Lord and submit to Him before the punishment comes upon you; then you will not be helped.

# No Forgiveness for Shirk

Surah 4:48 - Indeed, Allah does not forgive association with Him, but He forgives what is less than that for whom He wills. And he who associates others with Allah has certainly fabricated a tremendous sin.

# Ultimate Decision made by Allah

Surah 28:67-68 - But as for one who had repented, believed, and done righteousness, it is promised by Allah that he will be among the successful. And your Lord creates what He wills and chooses; not for them was the choice. Exalted is Allah and high above what they associate with Him.

# Judgment by Works

Surah 99:6-8 - That Day, the people will depart separated [into categories] to be shown [the result of] their deeds. So whoever does an atom's weight of good will see it, And whoever does an atom's weight of evil will see it.

# Hell is Created for Men and Genies

Surah 32:13 - And if we had willed, We could have given every soul its guidance, but the word from Me will come into effect [that] "I will surely fill Hell with jinn and people all together."

# Promise for Martyrs

Surah 3:195 - And their Lord responded to them, "Never will I allow to be lost the work of [any] worker among you, whether male or female; you are of one another. So those who emigrated or were evicted from their homes or were harmed in My cause or fought or were killed - I will surely remove from them their misdeeds, and I will surely admit them to gardens beneath which rivers flow as reward from Allah, and Allah has with Him the best reward."

# Prophets

**The Prophets of God** - According to the Qur'an, God has sent a prophet to every nation to preach the message of the one God. In all, 124,000 prophets have been sent, according to tradition. Most are unknown, but many include biblical personages such as Adam, Noah, Abraham, Moses, David, Solomon, Jonah, John the Baptist, and Jesus. Each prophet was given for a particular age, but Muhammad is the only prophet who is for all time. He is considered to be the "Seal of the Prophets."

# Scripture

**The Holy Books** - Four of the high-ranking prophets were given books of divine revelation. Those four are Moses, who was given *Tawrat* (Torah), David, who was given the *Zabur* (Psalms), Jesus, who was given the *Injil* (Gospel), and Muhammad, who was given the Qur'an. Of those four books, Muslims contend that only the Qur'an has been preserved in an uncorrupted state.

# Believe the Writings

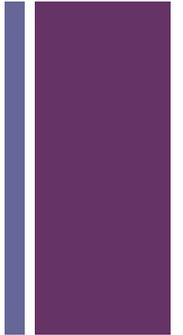
Surah 4:136: O you who have believed, believe in Allah and His Messenger and the Book that He sent down upon His Messenger and the Scripture which He sent down before. And whoever disbelieves in Allah , His angels, His books, His messengers, and the Last Day has certainly gone far astray.

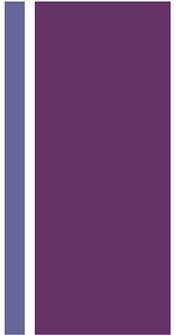
# + The Role of Women

- Polygamy: S. 4:3 One husband with four wives, and what the right hand possesses (slaves/concubines), but no reciprocity for women.
- Men excel, or are 'above' women S. 4:34, 'God has made the one above the other.'
- Wife Beating: S. 4:34, stipulates that men may beat their wives. However, there is no reciprocity for women, who instead have to work it out 'peacefully' if they fear the same 'rebellion.'
- Divorce in the Qur'an is the prerogative of the husband, woman do not choose, if they, women, do choose to divorce [known as *khul*] they need to hand over their mahr, bridewealth back to the husband. S. 65:2; 2:229.





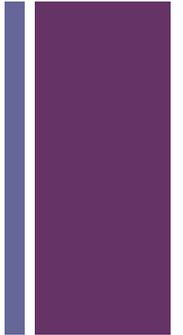
# Questions That You Must Address



1. Can God be tempted?
  - No. God cannot be tempted with evil because He has no innate sin nature. Jesus was tested by Satan, but when there is no desire, there is no temptation, (only a tempter).
  
2. Is Jesus the Son of Man/God?
  - Jesus both stated that He was God and acted like He was God. Either he was a liar or He was God.
  
3. Is the Bible corrupt?
  - Is the Qur'an corrupt? If God could protect the Qur'an in perfect condition, why would you say He could not preserve the Bible? In public view, we have thousands of copies in which there is 99.9% agreement. Where are the copies of the Qur'an that date back to the original?



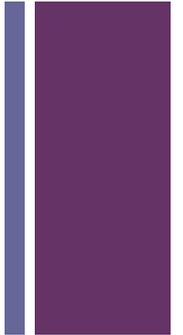
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


4. God provided original forgiveness to Adam.
  - What does that forgiveness guarantee for Adam? Is he assured heaven? Why or why not? Why was a curse given? What are the implications of the curse? Is God holy (sinless)? What is the basis for his justice? Does he need to punish sin or can he just overlook it? Why does he overlook some sin, but not other's sin? The God of the Bible is holy, just, and love. The cross is how those three work together.
  
5. God would never let one of His prophets die on a cross.
  - The ultimate act of love and mercy is to give yourself for someone. The God of the Bible showed the highest act of mercy and praise, by giving Himself for mankind.

# + How to Win Muslims

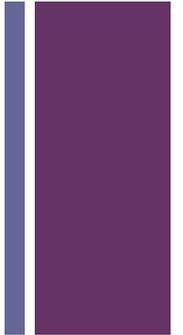
- Establish friendship. The Muslim will be impressed with a Christian's words only if he experiences genuine friendship from the Christian and sees him living a consistent moral life. The goal is to demonstrate to these people the love and quality of life in Christ. It is better to win the Muslim as a friend than to win an argument and lose his friendship. Avoid critical remarks about Muhammad, the *Qur'an*, and Islam even if your faith is criticized. Your patience, understanding, and display of friendship can cause the Muslim to be attracted to the Bible and the Christian faith.
- Pray for discernment. Only God can help you share the best possible answer when you talk with Muslims.
- Respect the culture. It will be easier to witness if the Christian shares with his or her own gender.

- Seek dialogue. So much of our witnessing is monologue. We were created with two ears and one mouth—learn to use them accordingly. The best evangelistic encounter with a Muslim is when there are plenty of questions asked by both sides. It is our job to listen, be attentive (be able to repeat back what is told to us) and ask plenty of questions to show respect and to get the people to talk about their personal beliefs. A good way to open a dialogue is to ask a Muslim to tell you what his religion is and what he believes.
  - Find a witnessing hook. For me, it has been their respect for Moses the prophet and the acceptance of Christ as a prophet.
  - Share your testimony. Nothing will be more effective than for you to share the life-changing, life-transforming power of God in your life. Remember the Muslim mind is one of fatalism—they have little input on their destiny. Not so with our God!



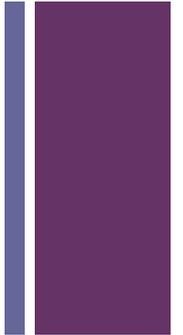
# What Stories Appeal to Muslims?



1. God's goodness, love, reliability, and care for his servants.
  - These qualities are demonstrated in the stories of Abraham, Joseph, the Exodus, Daniel, Jesus, and the Apostles, among others.
  
2. God's guidance of history towards good ends as he works through events to oppose evil, to train his servants in righteousness and truth, and to fulfill his good purposes for his people. Open-minded Muslims find much in the Bible that is good news . . .
  - This is clearly seen in the stories of Abraham, Joseph, Moses, Ruth, David, Jonah, Daniel, Job, and in Revelation.
  
3. The portrait of Jesus himself: his kindness, devotion, wisdom, power, and ongoing reign as Savior and King.



4. The love and forgiveness exhibited by true followers of Jesus.
  - This is prescribed in the Gospels, particularly the Sermon on the Mount, and it can be seen in stories from the Acts of the Apostles and in the lives of true disciples that people meet today. A similar theme is present in the story of Joseph.
5. The offer of personal forgiveness and acceptance by God.
  - This is presented in the Gospels and in Acts.
6. The offer of inner cleansing and renewal through God's Holy Spirit.
  - These are presented in segments of the Gospels, Acts, and Epistles.





7. The offer of assured and complete salvation from hell and acceptance into God's kingdom.
  - This is foretold in Isaiah 53, and it comes out in the Gospels, particularly in Matt. 11:27–29; Luke 7:36–50; 10:20; 12:32; 23:42–43; John 3:14–16; 11:25–27; 20:31.
8. The offer of a personal relationship with the Lord, fully realized in the next life.
  - This is seen in Matt. 18:20; 28:20; John 14:16–20; Acts 18:10; Rev. 21–22.
9. The offer and example of grace to live a godly life through the strengthening and guidance of the Holy Spirit.
  - This is described in the Acts of the Apostles and in some of the Epistles.
10. Power to resist and repel Satan and evil spirits.
