The Rev. Collins Etchi Ako is a missionary with the General Board of Global Ministries of The United Methodist Church, providing administrative and liaison support in the East Congo Episcopal Area in the Democratic Republic of Congo.

Collins is from Cameroon and an ordained elder of the United Methodist Church. He has also been deeply involved in the denomination's Young People's Ministries, related to Discipleship Ministries. Locally, Collins has served as coordinator of mission volunteers for the Cameroon Mission and as an associate pastor with Blessing UMC, Simbock, Yaounde and Mount Carmel UMC in Nkolbissong, Yoaunde.

At his missionary place of assignment with the East Congo Episcopal Area, Collins is involved in ministries with vulnerable girls and women, in ministries with orphans, and in teaching ministries at the UMC University in Kindu where he offers lectures in missiology and in ecclesiology. Collins is married to Anne Greta and the couple have four children.
