# **SUMMER WORSHIP SERIES**

#### THE SACRED ORDINARY: ENCOUNTERING GOD IN OUR EVERYDAY LIVES

Just as marriages are not about the wedding, and parenting is not just about the birth, our lives as disciples are about so much more than the great celebrations of Easter, Christmas, or even baptism. It is the daily commitments and often mundane practices that become habits that form us into the partners, parents and disciples we want to be. In the church year, the longest season is "Ordinary Time," the vast stretch of nearly 6 months between Pentecost and Advent that serves as a season of growth. Admittedly, the word "ordinary" can sound pretty boring, uninspiring, and just "blah." While there are no major church holidays until November, this "ordinary" season is a time to nurture a mature and grounded faith, a season of growth (thus, its' color is green) not focused on big celebrations, but seeking to grow deeper roots and expand our hearts and lives more fully in the experience of God's love and grace.

This summer, Pastor Amy will be using Tish Harrison Warren's book, "The Liturgy of the Ordinary: Sacred Practices in Everyday Life" as a guide book as we reflect on our lives of discipleship in the day-to-day commitments and practices that form us. While there can be a tendency to become lax in our faith lives during the warm summer months, we invite you to "lean in" to the season of growth as we consider our ordinary, every day lives of Christian discipleship.
