# **"The Sacrifice of Isaac"** Genesis 22:1-24 For the week of March 21, 2021

### The Test

Read Genesis 22:1-8. What was Abraham's test? What did God command Abraham to do?

### What's in a Name?

Now read Genesis 17:5. In the Old Testament, names were often given for their meaning. What does "Abraham" mean? Was Abraham encouraged by this change of name? Why or why not?

Just for fun: What does your first name mean? Share with your group!

### Obey?

Abraham may have been confused, even shocked that God was asking him to do this. Why? Read Genesis 17:15-21; 22:2.

How willing was Abraham to obey God's command? Remember, Abraham has already sent Ishmael away. How would God fulfill His promises with both Isaac and Ishmael gone? How do you see Abraham take deliberate steps of faith to obey God (Genesis 22:3)?

If you were in Abraham's "shoes," how would you respond to this? Why?

## "The Lord will provide"

Read Genesis 22:9-14. In dramatic fashion, just as Abraham is about to slay his son, God intervenes. What name does Abraham give to the place? Share one example in your life where God provided, especially in an unexpected way. How did this life event impact your faith?

## Testing & Faith

Read James 1:3-4; 1 Peter 1:6-7. How do you benefit from testing? Share a time in your life when your faith has been tested. What did you learn about God during this time?

Here is something to think about as you read this account: Isaac was not a small child, but rather a young man. What faith did Isaac demonstrate once he knew his father's intention to harm him (Genesis 22:9)? What was God's purpose in this test (Genesis 22:12)?

Read Genesis 22:13-19. What stopped Abraham from carrying out his son's sacrifice? What was provided instead? We often hear the phrase "to step out in faith." Obviously, this a great example. How is faith increased when faced with a difficult situation, or a trial? Discuss in your group.

Read Hebrews 11:17-19. How was Abraham's faith increased from the incident with Isaac?
