Romans 5:6-11 For the week of January 15, 2023

Reflection

The apostle is emphasizing that the death of Christ¹⁷ took place, not for good people, but for people still sinners. The emphasis is on our unhappy state. We were weak, ungodly sinners (v. 8), and God's enemies (v. 10). "Weak" (NIV, *powerless*) refers to moral frailty rather than to physical weakness. We were quite powerless to help ourselves (and unable even to understand the things of God, 1 Cor. 2:14, let alone act on them). But God's love triumphed where human power failed.¹
