fro of the pri ha dis fro ve are	Paul anticipates and responds to Jewish objections to what he has written. He imagines Jews obesting somewhat as follows: 'Surely, Paul, you can't possibly treat us as if we were no different and Gentile outsiders? Have you forgotten that we have been given both the law (the revelation God) and circumcision (the sign of the covenant of God)? Have you overlooked the fact that ese three privileges (covenant, circumcision, and law) are themselves tokens of the greatest vilege of all, that God chose us to be his special people? Are you saying that we Jews (who we been uniquely favoured by God's election) are no better off than the Gentiles? How can you sregard these peculiar blessings of ours, which distinguish us from the Gentiles and protect us an God's judgment?' In reply to such questions Paul writes about the law in verses 17–24 and about circumcision in reses 25–29, and insists that neither guarantees Jewish immunity to divine judgment. His words a 'a pricking of the balloon of Jewish pride and presumption'. – John Stott Deservation (vs. 17-20) Summarize these verses.
