

ISAIAH 53: THE SUFFERING SERVANT

Raised and Exalted

Isaiah 53:10-12

He is Risen!

Isaiah 53

The Messiah will be disfigured and marred (52:13-15)

...so that you can see His glory!

The Messiah will be despised and rejected (53:1-3)

...so that you can be accepted!

The Messiah will suffer and sacrifice Himself (53:4-6)

...so that you can be healed!

The Messiah will give His very life and die (53:7-9)

...so that you can live!

The Messiah will be raised and exalted (53:10-12)

The Resurrection Promise

1. From His death comes life (Isaiah 53:10).

Yet it was the LORD's will to crush him and cause him to suffer, and though the LORD makes his life an offering for sin, he will see his offspring and prolong his days, and the will of the LORD will prosper in his hand. (Is 53:10)

Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. Do you believe this?" (Jn 11:25–26)

2. From His suffering comes righteousness (Isaiah 53:11).

After he has suffered, he will see the light of life and be satisfied; by his knowledge my righteous servant will justify many, and he will bear their iniquities. (Is 53:11)

Can a mortal be innocent before God? Can anyone be pure before the Creator? (Job 4:17)

For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God. He was put to death in the body but made alive by the Spirit. (1 Pe 3:18)

3. From His intercession comes victory (53:12).

Therefore I will give him a portion among the great, and he will divide the spoils with the strong, because he poured out his life unto death, and was numbered with the transgressors. For he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors. (Is 53:12)

Therefore he is able to save completely those who come to God through him, because he always lives to intercede for them. (Heb 7:25)

For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus. (1 Ti 2:5)

But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Co 15:57)
