Learning Contentment (Phil. 4:11)

"Better is a little"

Better is the little that the righteous has than the abundance of many wicked. For the arms of the wicked shall be broken, but the LORD upholds the righteous.
(Psalm 37:16-17)

Better is a little with the fear of the LORD than great treasure and trouble with it.
(Proverbs 15:16)

Better is a little with righteousness than great revenues with injustice. (Proverbs 16:8)

Keeping an Eternal Perspective (1 Tim. 6:11-12)

Godliness holds promise now and later.

*...for while bodily training is of some value, godliness is of value in every way, as it holds promise for the present life **and also for the life to come.*** (1 Tim. 4:8)

Contentment teaches us to rely on Christ now because He will be with us forever.

*I can do all things **through him who strengthens me.*** (Phil. 4:13)

*Keep your life free from love of money, and be content with what you have, for he has said, **"I will never leave you nor forsake you."*** (Heb. 13:5)

Our true great gain is the eternal life to which we have been called.
