Dear Friends in Christ,

Grace and peace to you from God, who is breaking new ground this spring, and our Lord and Risen Savior Jesus Christ.

Spring is fully on the way. Gray and brown move over for robin's egg blue and new blades of green grass. And we welcome it! After months of bundling up, staying cozy at home has finally lost its charm. I chuckle to myself thinking how I enjoyed November snowflakes and first cups of hot cocoa and pumpkin spice everything.

Thank goodness for seasons! We usher each one in with gratitude at the change of pace. Yet, each one can overstay its welcome, especially the South Dakota seasons of Winter and Road Construction. The seasons of nature often coincide with the seasons of the Church. This winter, our Journey learners became familiar with the liturgical calendar. The calendar of the Church year is often represented in a wheel-shaped diagram. Round and round we travel through the remembrance of the promise of God's love and salvation for us and for the world.


The first Sunday in Advent is the beginning point of the year as we prepare for the celebration of Jesus' birth at Christmas. Christmas is followed by Epiphany, a season of revelation—of heavenly ahas. From Epiphany we enter Lent through the festival of the Transfiguration of Our Lord. Lent is our annual trip toward Easter, full of reverence, repentance, paying attention, prayer, and possibility.

Lent also happens to be set in one of the most dramatic changes of the natural seasons in my opinion: from Winter into Spring. What a perfect pair of longings. The longing for lengthened days and people emerging from hibernation—alongside our soul's longing for release from the deep suffering of human captivity to sin. This is the longing for a Savior.

As hope-filled buds and blades poke up from once barren winter soil, so Jesus, after three days buried in the ground, emerges alive with the promise of new life in tow. Christ breaks the ground for us and unbinds us from the dormancy of death once and for all. Alleluia!

This spring another type of ground-breaking will be happening in our midst. It is also an emergence full of hope and the promise of life. On the northeast end of our property, we will see a dream take physical shape as the Brookings food insecurity solutions facility begins to be built. We are grateful to be partners in this project, sharing property for a new home for the Brookings Area Food Pantry, the Backpack Program, the United Way, and more helping organizations in our community. What a joy it will be to be a part of sharing the Good News of the resurrection, new life, in tangible ways with our neighbors experiencing hunger. I pray you will see this change of seasons, this breaking of the ground, as a sign of hope. Thank you for your part in making it possible as you have trusted God and supported our congregation throughout the years, in each and every season.

FROM THE BISHOP'S DESK


Easter People,


He has risen!

News From Dee Shanley, Your Missionary in Belize

Returning as a volunteer teacher in January for the 2nd semester at Alvin L. Young High School in Belize, I found the school continuing with virtual learning. As restrictions were lifted we began returning to in-person classes. Along with the plan to return to campus came challenges for the students. Many had no money to pay for transportation, or to purchase school lunch. Thankfully my friends at First Lutheran sent money with me for unexpected expenses and student needs. I offered up those funds to the school to distribute to the students. Those needs were met, and now a majority of the students have been able to return to school for in-person learning.

On behalf of First Lutheran, I spent a weekend at Camp SeKonsa, a nearby camp for children with disabilities. Although the FLC Belize Team had postponed their mission trip to Camp SeKonsa, I was able to represent our team by providing a donation for supplies and labor to complete an ADA approved bathroom.

I also spent a weekend in service at the camp with students from the high school. We worked hard to clean the campgrounds and then served the children with disabilities attending the camp by providing activities and games. It was truly a blessed and eventful day for all as students learned how to live out their Christian faith by helping others.

Wednesday night meals have been serving more people also. Thank you to the great volunteers who help serve all our families who use this meal as an opportunity to share time together.


