# *Holy Baptism of Anson Jon Sogn*

## **PRESENTATION**

*Pastor* God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word, God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

*Pastor* Called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, parents, do you desire to have Anson Jon Sogn baptized into Christ?

*Parents* *I do.*

*Pastor* As you bring Anson to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities: to live with him among God's faithful people, bring him to the word of God and the holy supper, teach him the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in his hands the holy scriptures, and nurture him in faith and prayer, so that he may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

*Pastor* Do you promise to help Anson grow in the Christian faith and life?

*Parents* *I do.*

*Pastor* Sponsors, do you promise to nurture Anson in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help him live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

*Sponsors* *I do.*

*Pastor* People of God, do you promise to support Anson and pray for him in his new life in Christ?

*Congregation* **We do.**

## **PROFESSION OF FAITH**

*Pastor* Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God, the powers of this world that rebel against God, and the ways of sin that draw you from God?

*Congregation* **I renounce them.**

*The presiding minister addresses the candidates and the assembly.*

*Pastor* Do you believe in God the Father?

*Congregation* **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**






