Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path. (Psalm 119:105 NRSV)



A little-known fact about one of your pastors: Did you know that I have stubbed and dislocated my little toe more than five times?! This recurring phenomenon in my life started after I had children, and I assume is a result of being overloaded with many things to keep track of and the speedy way I sometimes rush around trying to get things done. But almost every single time I've stubbed my toe, it has been in the dark, navigating my bedroom floor without light to illuminate the obstacles in my way.



Stubbing your little toe is so very painful. When it happens it becomes the only part of my body that I can feel, and it demands all my attention. That's a message for another day (1 Corinthians 12:12-26)! The worst part about my toe-stubbing incidents, though, is that they put me out of commission. All the things I might have been rushing around trying to do... well, now I could do none of them as I was stuck on the couch with ice and elevation until my toe would return to normal again.



As people of God, as a congregation, and as the entire Church in our Western context, we sometimes rush around in a dark room trying to get this and that done. When, all of a sudden, we stub our toe. We step on a good relationship and harm it. We exclude someone whom we have overlooked. We make a mistake and miss an opportunity. We pass up the chance to savor a moment with someone who needs our full attention. We forget to listen, to others or to God, and we end up headed in the wrong direction with consequences for our missteps.



This school year we are going to slow down and turn on some lights. We are going to be listening together. We're going to do a little less and take a little more time to be <u>in the moment</u>. We will be doing all of this in order to discern (prayerfully discover) a set of values, priorities, and plans for the future. God has promised us a future. God has promised a safe place to set our feet as we move in faith together. We do have to turn on the light switch and slow down to avoid stubbing our toes in the process.



You are invited around the table to be a part of this great listening. Beginning on September 10th in fact. We will all worship together with one service at 9am. Let's pack the sanctuary and fill it with all of our congregation's gifts! Then we ask you to come contribute to and enjoy a good old Potluck, brunch style. After we eat, we will stay a while at tables and answer questions about who we are, what we care about, and how we hear God calling us to set our feet into the future. We need your head, your heart, your ears around the table. Without you, we will shed less light on the ground ahead of us and we will make less confident steps into God's promised future. Please, plan to be there, to slow down, to listen to each other and God's still, small voice that speaks through Scripture





Until then, God guide your footsteps and cast light on your path.

For as long as I can remember, my mother was an avid seamstress. She learned to sew in high school and continued to use her skill all through her life. Each fall she made me school clothes in the latest fashion, and every Christmas & Easter I had a fabulous new ensemble to wear to church. She even made my bridesmaid dresses, and when I was in theater productions, she made my costumes. Throughout her life she demonstrated her love of others by sewing clothes, costumes, fabric crafts, but most of all . . . quilts. She LOVED making quilts! She made special quilts for both of her grandchildren, for me and for my sister, for her friends and relatives, but also for people she didn't even know as an avid member of St. John Lutheran Church's quilting group. But even as I admired my mom for her sewing skills—and benefitted from them immensely—I adamantly refused to learn how to sew myself. One of the items I asked my mother to make for me most often was a set of personalized pillowcases that I would give as gifts, especially to my students who were graduating from high school. However, the year after my mother passed away, I suddenly realized that my never-ending font of handmade gifts had ceased to exist as suddenly as she had. I was stumped. What would I do now? And then my eyes fell on my mom's old war horse of a sewing machine . . . and I knew what I had to do! I would have to teach myself how to sew! And I did. It certainly wasn't pretty, at first. But as I continued to practice, I felt my mother's presence surround me. And with every completed project and handmade gift, I grew more confident in my skills and felt more connected to my mother's memory. I hadn't really thought of quilting as I was learning how to sew. That seemed quite beyond my meager skills and level of experience! But one day I decided to see what it might be like to join other sewers, so I attended the Monday night "Sew What?" group here at church. I was instantly welcomed by warm, enthusiastic, and passionate women who were excited that I was there and who were happy to show me all kinds of new techniques to try on my machine. Soon, I started attending the Tuesday morning quilters as well as the Monday night group. And not only did my confidence at the sewing machine grow, but so did my relationship with these kind, compassionate, hard-working --Julie Bergan Abraham women!

With 62 supporters in attendance, the FLC Belize Mission Team found much to celebrate at a July 20 gathering in the Mission Coffee House: Dee Shanley's return home with updates from her ministry as a volunteer sewing instructor, strong scholarship support locally for her high school students, stories of student achievements, and an FLC travel team returning after a safe and successful mission last spring.

Jim Schade led the presentation by reviewing mission trip activities with slides illustrating the ease and joy of travel to Belize as a group. Worship activities with children at a mission site included singing, crafts, fellowship, eating and just plain fun! The team also completed several construction projects, attended the morning chapel, and met the scholarship students at Dee's school. In addition, the team served at Camp SeKonsa, helping to clean and prepare the camp for the first overnight stay for children with disabilities. They all enjoyed a day of worship/learning, play, crafts and celebrating God's love for them.

Dee began by thanking sponsors for their support of the students, whether through scholarships or general donations. She then provided an update on the scholarship students, using their theme of Dreaming Big, by reaching their goal of graduating high school. Dee's Big Dream is to increase the number of scholarships from 32 students to 50 at the high school for the upcoming year. Nancy Schade followed Dee with examples of worship experiences at Camp SeKonsa. She especially appreciated the opportunity to share the promise of God's love and care, forever! (Isaiah 62:3).



After Pastor Trey's luncheon blessing, attendees enjoyed authentic Belizean cuisine. Deb Pederson and Kimberly Retterath prepared a main dish of chicken, beans, and rice with a side of fried plantains and coleslaw; Jean Gentry (pictured at left) and Mary Moeller fried fresh corn tortillas, Jim Schade made "pawda" buns; and Jen Swartz baked coconut tarts and meat pies.

The 2023 Belize travel team had also prepared poster and story boards illustrating their mission work. Featured Student Caylin Cocom




Caylin received a scholarship to attend her first year of high school at Alvin L. Young. During her second year, she suffered from a serious kidney disease. Unable to





PRESCHOOL NEWS



Summer has flown by, and we are gearing up for a full year of fun. August will begin trainings for our volunteers and nursery workers. Did you know that First Lutheran has paid nursery workers? Our nursery is for children 0-3 years old. We also provide care for various classes and events which can be extended to older children in a separate room. Journey to Discipleship is our Christian Education programming starting with children who are 3 years old by September 1 and are fully toilet trained and going through the age of 5th grade. We have 2 options for Journey to Discipleship. Sundays we have a multi age setting from 9:40-10:20 am. Wednesday programming is from 6-7 pm with an opportunity for a meal at 5 pm. These programs are only possible with the help of volunteers. Volunteers range from 6th graders to older adults. Volunteers do not need to prepare lessons or supplies; these are done for them. It is helpful to be familiar with the story & lesson provided prior to class. All volunteers are required to attend 1 training course in August. Those over age 18 are background checked. God asks us to <mark>serve, God asks</mark> us to share his love with others, volunteering with the Children of our church family is a fun, engaging, and very rewarding way to live out God's word. PLEASE consider volunteering to help with Journey to Discipleship. There are so many ways to volunteer with this program. Note something New: A parent session has been added to the beginning of Journey programming this year. (See September dates) We ask that one or more parent/guardian attend this session. Families will receive information on the calendar, policies & procedures, lessons for the year, Christmas program, meet your child's teacher's, learn about upcoming events, and so much more.
