Through this week away our youth learned first hand what the communities outside our tidy midwestern bubble can look like. In a new place, surrounded by caring locals and Lutherans from far and wide to guide them with words, action, and education on how we may be able to live into God's hopes for us.

Imagine walking down any given street in a major city and seeing hoards of youth in matching shirts! Everyone in town knew something was going down. And that something was the 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering! Folks flocked from all over the US, Puerto Rico, Canada, and even a speaker from The Holy

In our evening mass gatherings- of 18,000 people- we heard from pastors, authors, professors, as well as youth and young adults on the main stage. Every story was different but they uplifted what it means to be "Created To Be".

Relating to God in our fast paced modern age can seem hard but we had the opportunity to be ushered into a wave of God's creation in a new light. The week went by in a flash where we began in worship with the three synods from the Dakotas and ended in a full service with communion in the mass gathering. We had the opportunity to explore the city both in a scavenger hunt and in our own hunt for beignets and jazz. We had hours dedicated to an interactive center where we could play, learn, create, and rest. This looked like college ministries, Global miniatures, life simulators, community art and so much more. On our Accompaniment day we learned about environmental injustice and ethical power sources (84% of South Dakota's electrical net generation is from renewable resources!). Of course most folks are excited by the food in NOLA. We were among them trying many new and delicious foods: Charbroiled oysters, grits, jambalaya, and red fish to name a few.

The food and the music will linger in our minds just as the liquid IV will linger in our water bottles but the experience of seeing a stadium FULL of youth excited to praise God together, that feeling of belonging has created a core memory for a lifetime. There is a kind of energy and excitement that can only come from a youthful exuberance for God. Most of our youth had no idea what they were getting themselves into but they were all in and they will most definitely bring that fire with them wherever they go.

Thank you to the adult leaders who helped to make this trip happen safely from start to finish. Geoff and Alecia, y'all are amazing and we are lucky to have had you.

Thank you to every human who donated to help make this trip happen, we would not have gotten far without your commitment and vision for the future of our church and the current value our youth bring to our space. You sent them off to learn what makes up an ELCA Lutheran, and they have come back knowing more clearly who God has



#### **New-Fashion Quilting Bee Serves Others**

If walls could talk, the concrete blocks of a gym built for bouncing balls would report hearing a different sound on Saturday, June 15: the hum of 24 sewing machines and the chatter of 68 workers gathered for a new-fashion quilting party. The occasion was the second annual First Lutheran Church (FLC) Quilting Bee, held to support the ministry of Lutheran World Relief (LWR). In 7 hours, the crew, ages 6 – 95, completed and boxed up 40 quilts with 20 more waiting for a finishing edge. The children, meanwhile, focused on ripping and winding cotton sheet strips for bandages. They produced forty coils that will be sent to Global Health Ministries for distribution.

The volunteers, coming from various churches in the area, were energized from 9 to 4 with 2 coffee breaks and a boxed lunch at noon. Thrivent Action Team grants provided the food and the sewing notions. Additionally, FLC quilters have appreciated the generous donations of fabric from church and community members.

Mary Tereszkiewicz, a visiting guest from the LWR warehouse in Baltimore, MD, provided expert advice and thanked the group for serving the needs of people they will never meet. She specifically recognized FLC quilter Faye Dahl for faithfully encouraging others in this ministry by challenging the FLC quilters to reach a goal of 400 quilts produced this year. Tereszkiewicz explained that the national office has noticed the work accomplished in Brookings for some time now.
