TODAY'S CALL TO WORSHIP

Today's handbell piece is a soon to be published arrangement of Martin Luther's "Lord Keep Us Steadfast In Your Word" and is dedicated to FLC Handbell Choir Director Barbara Horten.

A note from Barbara Horten on its meaning: It's first verse is an appeal to God to preserve and sustain us by His Word, rather than by force of arms. In the second verse, Luther emphasizes the ultimate authority of Jesus Christ over rulers of any kind and that His rescue of His people always leads to praise and thanksgiving. The final verse calls on the Holy Spirit to send unity to the people of God and encourages s to trust that we will be raised from the dead to eternal life, as we confess in the Apostles' Creed.
