Fellow Followers of Jesus.

In the summer I'm reminded that I have the best job in the world because I get to go to Bible Camp as a part of my work. It's refreshing to be in God's creation for hours on end. It's inspiring to circle around a campfire and hear children and young adults praise God at the top of their lungs. It's rewarding to hear confessions of faith spoken by those who've been immersed in God's Word. It's energizing to bask in the proclamations at pick up time, "I'll be back next summer!"

This week of concentrated community let loose in creation, soaking in the Word, refuels me for a year of ministry in our congregation. The best part is that I'm not the only one refueled, as camp multiplies those who are ready to bring this energy to the life we share together through First Lutheran.

The 2025 theme for Lutheran Outdoor Ministries has been: God's Word Comes Near. And it sure does! Not only at camp. Daily, God's word encounters us, interrupts us, guides us, redirects us. As folks put together the Bible study for camps across the ELCA this summer, they thought of ways God's Word comes near, highlighting these:

God's Word Comes Near in Trusting
God's Word Comes Near in Listening
God's Word Comes Near in Serving
God's Word Comes Near in Following

On Friday, as counselors and staff prepared to send the crew of reenergized 4th through 12th grade disciples into communities like Howard, Sisseton, and Brookings, they focused on the way God's Word comes near in following. In the closing campfire the counselor sharing the message said we often talk about faithful leadership. Camp makes leaders. God has created you to lead others in the way of Jesus, a way of love, light, and life. But, he said, we sometimes forget God also needs us to be followers. If we are to lead anyone, we must first follow. Follow...of course, ultimately: Jesus.

It matters who we follow. In the realm of social media "following" takes on a new meaning. When you follow a content creator, you'll see their face, hear their words. They'll pop up in your newsfeed, and you'll tune in and begin to adopt the message they're sending you. We call those we follow in this way "influencers." What a powerful role to give someone. Whether you're on social media or not, there are voices you tune into. There are people you look to for advice, as an example, to find a way and even, sometimes, a sense of identity.

The Word of God comes near in our following. When we're following Jesus, God's Word guides our actions and fosters our identity. As we follow Jesus, God's Word is in our metaphorical newsfeed, and it leads us to love others with open minds and open hearts, to share what we have without fear, to stand up for justice, and to serve in ways that are Good News for those who need it. When we're following someone or something else-an influencer, a political party line, a salesperson with a silver bullet-well, then God's Word comes near to return us to the only one worthy of our followership.

You are called to follow Jesus and invited to notice the way God's Word Comes Near. May we do this with all of the energy and enthusiasm as a camper returning from the best week ever.




Looking into August and September, all the things will be starting back up. This year we are going to do Journey, Confirmation, and Youth Group starting in August and then go into May!

#### **INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH KIT**

**ONE** dark color, light-weight bath size towel (between 20"x40" and 52"x27")

**TWO** or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8-9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping

**ONE** adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging (multipacks may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-sized envelope; no plastic bags or wrap)

**ONE** sturdy comb, remove packaging

**ONE** metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

# **Creation Care**Faith That Sees the Earth Anew

Dear Members and Friends of First Lutheran,

This fall, as the natural world begins to turn in color and pace, we're spending a few weeks in worship and in life-together as a Season of Creation. From mid-September through early October, we're intentionally focusing on God's good creation in the natural world and our call to care for it.

This Season of Creation invites us to open our eyes to God's glory, not just as it is in heaven, but also on earth: in soil, sky, sea, and creatures of every kind. The scriptures we hear this season in worship tell of God's joy in finding what is lost, God's challenge to unjust systems, and God's entrusting us with a "good treasure". A small faith, even a mustard seed's worth, can reshape our relationship with the earth and with one another, that we might, by God's grace, see all things made new.
