Dear Coworkers in the Gospel,

Over the past year, the goal our Council has lifted up for our congregation has been **to be inviting**. As we dreamed up this focus for the past year, we envisioned a movement of invitation, reaching those disconnected or not yet connected to our congregation. We are around 300 people engaged in worship on a weekly basis, and even more than that number making up the community of First Lutheran. That meant that if each of us invited two or three people to join us in worship or come and see a part of the life of our church, over the course of the year, we would easily have invited 1,000 people! We *invited* you all to join in this effort starting last Easter, and we have so much to celebrate about our Year of Invitation so far.

We set up a visual representation of our goal of being invitational in the hall between the sanctuary and the Mission Coffeehouse. Cards represented all of the ways we invited people. By now there are over 50 cards hanging in the hallway, making it known that not only are all welcome here, but we are committed to extending that welcome by meeting people where they are and inviting them to come and see. I know from dozens of conversations that this visual representation does not capture all of the inviting we did this year. Many people would catch me around the church building or out in the community eager to share, "Pastor Jess, I invited someone!" And I would eagerly ask, "Did you put an invite card up in the hall?!" To which they would often reply, "Oh no, I didn't." Maybe they were too humble, or it was just too many steps, but I know for every card hanging in that hall there must have been at least ten invitations issued from one person to another.

We really made strides together. For some this might have been the first time they've ever taken on the fear of going outside of a comfort zone to invite someone. For others the challenge to be invitational had them looking at their life differently. Who do I know here... at work... in my neighborhood... among my friends... who might be longing for, or at least open to, an invitation?

As we head toward the end of our year-long focus on invitation, we are not done inviting. We have learned a lot about what works and what it takes to share a good invitation. We will continue to provide good old-fashioned paper invites for you to use to break the ice and share details of worship and other events. This is the best investment in spreading the word that we can make. Paper invitations are powerful when they are paired with *you*, sharing the personal call to come and see. We will continue to give you invitation tools via social media because they are fast and easy ways to share. We will continue to invite others because that's what Jesus asks us to do. We will continue to invite others because the Gospel and this community of followers is meaningful to us. We will continue to invite others because it is the way God's Kingdom multiplies and grows and why our congregation lives and breathes.

What's next? I'm so very excited to share with you the next focus we have dreamed up for our ministry together. That focus is *connection*. We are ready, and we hope you are too, to discover all of the ways we are already connected to each other and to God through First Lutheran Church. We are also eager to see what new ways of connecting God will help us create this year. Starting this Lent, we will get to work on a goal of connection with many opportunities for you to contribute. You are a piece of the puzzle when it comes to living into the mission we share to equip all people to live a life connected with God and others. I look forward to hearing what meaningful connections you treasure. I long to hear what meaningful connections you desire. Together we will expand the picture of God's love in our midst as we share it with one another and those we have yet to meet.

On Ash Wednesday, we receive Holy Communion, a foretaste of the feast to come, when Christ, not death, has the final Word.

First, I wanted to let everyone know that if you are interested in registering a child for preschool classes starting next fall, please call the preschool office and get your name on the mailing list. to call soon. Our classes fill up quickly. We offer classes to children ages 3 to 5 years of age. We also provide a Junior Kindergarten class for 5 year-olds. The children must be 3, 4, or 5 years old before September 1st, and toilet trained.





The weather outside might be cold, but Children's Ministry is really heating up in February!

We will continue to visit the story of Jesus Calming the storm. Here is a recap of the information given to all Journey to Discipleship families at the start of the year (also on the website)

Main Idea: Jesus is with you through the storms of life.

**Objective:** We can always have faith & never need to be afraid.

**Bible Verse:** *Matthew* 8:27 The Men were amazed and asked, "What kind of man s this? Even the winds and the waves obey him?"

Bible Story Reference: Spark Story Bible p. 286 Spark NRSV p. 106

This Bible story is a great way to help children when they are struggling or scared. Read the story together, then ask questions about the story. "What happened when Jesus was sleeping?" "How did the Disciples feel?" "What did Jesus do? What did he say?" How do the disciples feel then?"

Move the discussion to personal experience. How is what's happening with you (be specific) like what happened in this story? How do you feel? It can be difficult to know that God is always with you when you can't see him, but he is always with you. How does it feel to know that? That is faith.

Continue to discuss if the child is willing. Have them draw a picture of God with them, write a story, find a symbol (like a bracelet, etc.) they can have to remind them God is with them THEN PRAY TOGETHER. When you drop them off in the mornings, put them to bed or anytime, remind them..."God is with you, God loves you, and so do I!"

**Saul to Paul** Our next story will be about Saul to Paul. Here is a recap of the information given to all Journey to Discipleship families at the start of the year (also on the website)

Main Idea: God calls each of us to be followers of Jesus and promises to be with us.

**Objective:** Sometimes when we follow Jesus, we are called to do difficult things. God will always be there. **Bible Verse:** *Philippians 4:9* What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me – practice these things and the God of peace will be with you.

**Bible Story Reference**: Spark Story Bible p. 514 or Spark NRSV p. 1214-1215, Acts 9:1-22, Acts 22:1-16 p. 1232-1233 Romans 8:38-39 p. 1252

This story can touch on many aspects of life for our children. It shows that with God all people can change for the better. That God forgives people and so should we. Telling others about God and doing as God has asked is not always easy, but God will be with us through it all.

Paul becomes the greatest missionary of all time. We can learn so much from Paul.

#### 6-8th Grade Confirmation:

We returned to Confirmation and began studying our New Testament Story, The Parable of the Prodigal Son. Just like the Old Testament Story in the fall, we have looked at this story through 3 lenses to get a more full understanding of the text: What was the context in the story, what was the context at the time of the story being shared, and how does this relate now? In February we will learn about the Lutheran Sacraments of Baptism and Communion. Lent begins February 22<sup>nd</sup> with
