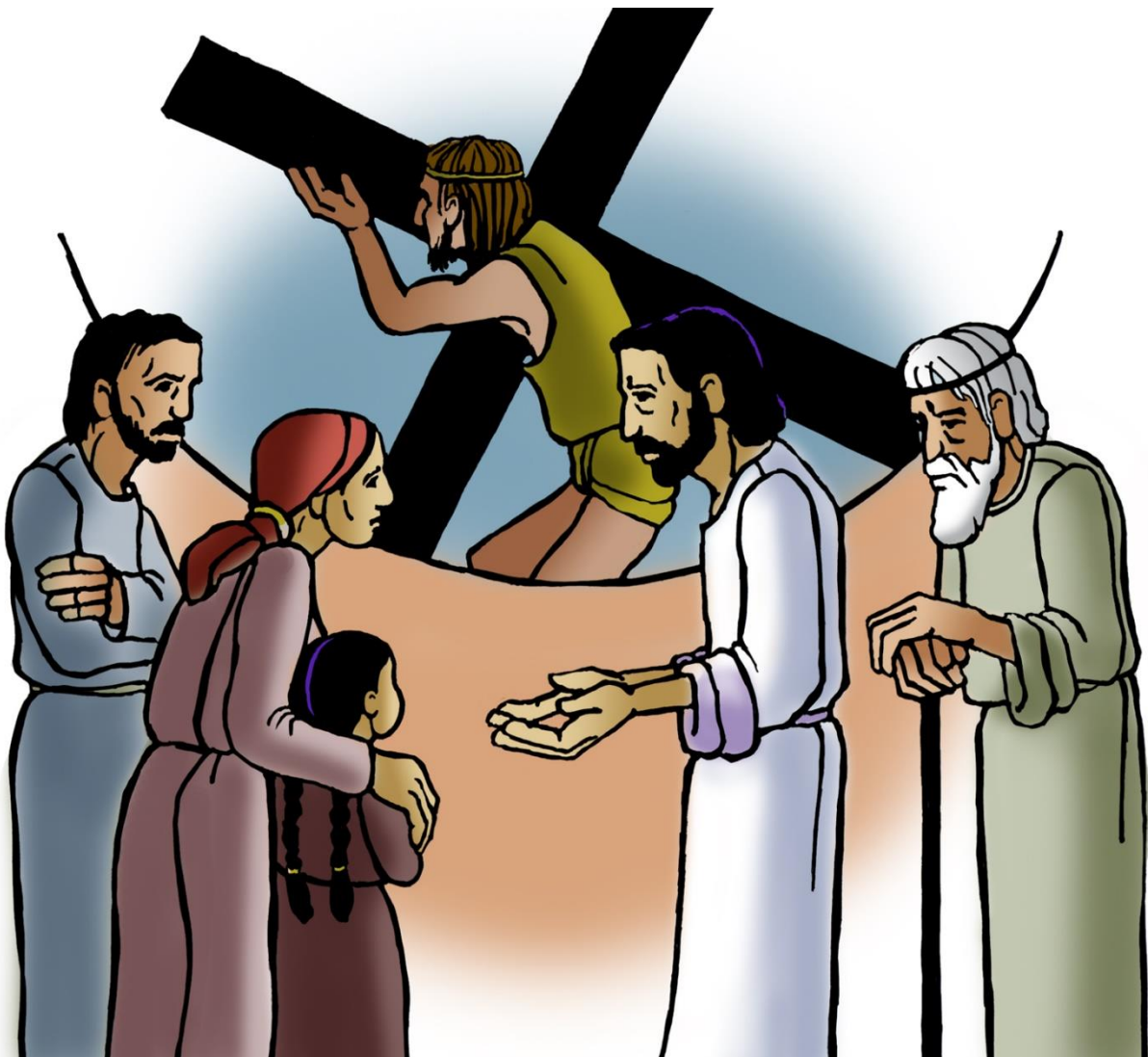

PRESENTATION

Pastor God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. 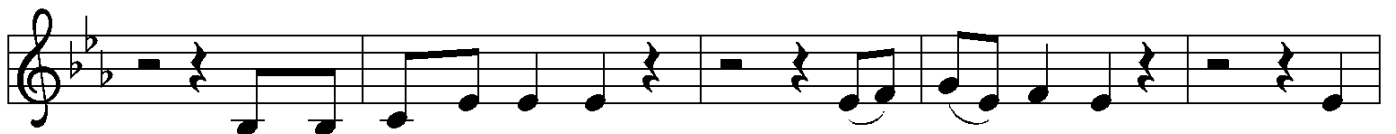

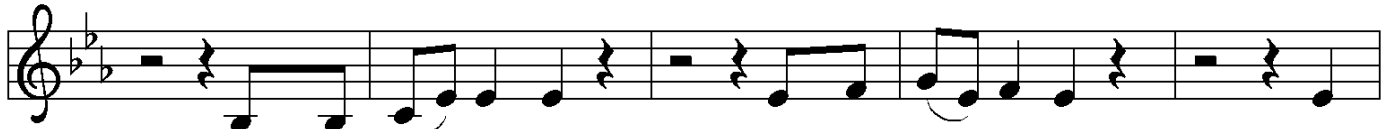
