

Dear Church,



No wonder we become tired of making decisions. From small, perhaps inconsequential choices like what to wear or whether to scratch an itch, to choosing very important things like yes or no to a new job opportunity or medical treatment, we're deciding all the time. How do you make decisions? What factors do you consider? What voices do you value? How do you know if you've chosen correctly?

As we move step by step into God's promised future as a congregation in our strategic planning process this year, we will make decisions along the way. Thank goodness we do not make these decisions alone. We make them together. We do not make them without guidance and inspiration. We believe God is speaking to us through the Word in Scripture and in the Living Word, Jesus. We trust that we can tune our hearts to the Holy Spirit's movement in and around us. We have faith that where two or more of us are gathered in conversation, worship, or prayer, God is with us. So, we know that God is with us as we listen faithfully and as we prepare to make decisions.

A couple of years ago, I was amid deep discernment, listening for the Spirit's particular call for my life. I was wondering what I was supposed to do next, and the decisions felt big, huge. It didn't help that the world was in upheaval in the height of the Pandemic. I couldn't see the path ahead. The future felt hazy. My sister-in-law sent me a book, "The Next Right Thing: A Simple, Soulful Practice for Making Life Decisions." The author, Emily Freeman, presents a method for making big decisions. She says that we should practice familiar but often forgotten advice: simply do the next right thing. This simple approach, she suggest, will clear the decision-making chaos and quiet the fear of choosing wrong.

Taking this approach and adding one ingredient became my way forward. Here's that ingredient: whatever we may choose, we know the ending and it is good.

God has taken care of the future. God has overcome the biggest fear we face, death itself, and every little fear-inducing thing beneath that. God's relentless love and resurrection power secure for us and all creation a future that is full of freedom, peace, joy, and the life that is truly life. It's the world's biggest and best spoiler alert. And it frees us from fear that our decisions may make or break us. We are free in Christ to make our little choices because Jesus has decided that we are His.

So, as we embark on listening to how we might share what we have as a congregation, how we might speak and be good news for those around us, and how we might be called to live and move and have our being, we do so wrapped in a promise. We do so resting in the reality of God's love for us and for our neighbor. We listen, not in fear, but in freedom. We trust that, while we may not be able to see the whole path spread out before us, God will give us a glimpse we need to take the next right step.

Fear not, and be not fatigued, the Lord our God is with us, Pastor Jess








#### LISTENING TO GOD: Our Fall Sermon and Scripture Series

"Who are we as a faith community? What unique things does God call our ministry to act upon? How can the Holy Spirit guide us in the coming years? These questions lay at the heart of this strategic planning process. Strategic Planning. Those words can feel so corporate, so far away from the life of a faith community. At the heart, strategic planning is a discernment process of listening. In the coming months we will have the opportunity to:

- Listen to God through Scripture
- Listen to God through the Congregation
- Listen to God through the Community

We will engage in a very intentional process of discernment. Trusting that the Holy Spirit speaks through every person, listening to many voices will play a central role. There will be opportunities for group conversation and dreaming... In every step of the process we will ask, "What do we hear God saying to us?" At several points in the process the Strategic Planning Team will gather us together and share what they have heard as a way of ensuring



that they are on the right track. All this listening will lead to a final document, clarifying our identity and providing a clear path for the coming years.

As we begin this journey together, one of the voices we will listen to is the voice of God in the Bible. Through weekly readings we will encounter many people of faith who heard God's call. Some of these stories will resonate and make you say, "That sounds like our community of faith!" Other stories may feel foreign and distant. God speaks in many ways to many people. Experiencing a wide range of Biblical stories will aid our discernment process. We invite you join us on this journey.

Every week (in October and November) we will provide one story of a person or community who discerned God's call for them. After reading the background to each passage, take some quiet time to read through the passage three times. After each reading, reflect on the following questions:

- How do the people in the story hear God's call to them?
- How open are they to God's call?
- What might this passage say to our community of faith?

We will provide opportunities for you to share your reflections on the ways these passages relate to our community of faith. Welcome to this journey of discernment. Together we will gain clarity about our ministry and boldly follow God into the future."

# **CONNECTION CORNER**

The summer youth Trip in 2022 had a change of plans from being in urban Minneapolis to being in the Boundary Waters of rural northern Minnesota. An important part of our youth trip is connection: to God, to each other, to ourselves, to nature. In a way, this journey started off with disconnection: we turned off our phones and left them at camp so we could be completely present and open to the world around us. On our drive north we learned about the indigenous people who have and do still reside on the land we were going to be on. We wanted to know how our visit would drip into the connectedness of history in that sacred space. Our crew leaned into the new connections with the land and water as we traveled by canoe and portaged all our gear in sun and rain. The reflection on how the land protects and provides permeated our trip as well as the notion of how we should strive to be better ancestors and stewards of the land. God called us into connection daily as we sought love notes from God; something that felt special just for ourselves in the jaw dropping creation. From one to another we created friendship

bracelets and filled them with prayers for the person we gifted them to as a reminder for that moment in time we shared together, in a space where we felt the significance of each person's movement. To be in a space of openness to something greater than we are, is one of the reasons I am called to youth ministry: humans crave connection deeply, as youth seek and experience things like our summer youth trips or our confirmation retreat a connectedness to faith, peers and, the world around them is cultivated and that is hard to replicate elsewhere.

















I've learned so much watching Mary Moeller's quiet, willing servant ways, always on target and making an outstanding difference wherever she serves. Mary has long been active in the Belize mission and is passionate about our quilting group. She is co-leader, with Pastor Trey, in the Tuesday afternoon Bible study and active in the children's ministry team, always serving with exceptional skill and insight.




#### Midshipman 1st Class, US Naval Academy

My favorite thing about First Lutheran Church is connecting with community members of all ages and generations. Growing up surrounded by this community of faith provided me with excellent role models for the type of Christ-follower I want to be when I get to their age. No matter at what age, First Lutheran provides people with opportunities to stay involved in their faith community outside of Sunday services, and it is this involvement that has led me

to remain part of a welcomig network of fellow Christians even after leaving for the Naval Academy. I started singing in the children's choir when I was 4 years old, played guitar for Confirmation worship in middle school, and sang in the adult choir in high school with my family and other singers from college-age to grandparents. My confirmation mentor, a National Guard soldier, was one of the people who inspired me to join the military, and I have met some wonderful FLC members in retirement age who are still eager to do community service work out in Brookings and in the church. It was here at First Lutheran where I discovered that worshipping through music is the best way for me to maintain and grow my relationship with God. Each Easter and Reformation Sunday, I had the privilege of blasting my trombone from the balcony in a resounding brass quintet with the Ropp family, and each Christmas Eve, I sang with the Ropps and my brother and parents at the late service, which was always my favorite part of that holiday. Each Wednesday in high school, I would come home from cross country practice and bike to choir practice with my parents after dinner, and I sang in the alto section next to my mom. Now that I am at the Naval Academy, I realize what a blessing I have been given in being able to come home for Christmas and sing on Christmas Eve with my family like always, and be greeted by the quilting ladies whom my mom has told all my sea stories to. Even after months away from Brookings, when I come back to First Lutheran, some congregation members have come and gone, but that multigenerational faith community and sense of home has never left.

We moved to Brookings in 1975. My two small boys and I joined First Lutheran Church – my first connection with FLC. I had many more FLC connections over the years. My third child was born in Brookings and then baptized at FLC. My three children were confirmed at FLC. Both my boys went through the scouting program with Troop 4 supported by FLC. My oldest son had his Eagle Scout Award Ceremony at FLC. My daughter was married at FLC, I feel connected to First

Each month, I have the privilege of visiting local care facilities to share God's Word with residents there. Some of them are members of First Lutheran, some are from area congregations, and others are guests who have joined for the day. Together, we pray, hear God's Word, join in song, and share the gifts of Holy Communion. I frequently let the group know that even though the whole First Lutheran Church community can't fit in our small room, we are nevertheless there together in spirit as the body of Christ. Although they may not make great photo opportunities, these ministries help people connect with God. and they serve our commitment (as we say in baptismal services) to "live among God's faithful people."

I'm so proud to be part of this church that cares for those whom we may not see. Thanks for connecting our church with them, connecting them with God, and through these holy connections, blessing the world.

I believe that FLC Mission Quilters has provided many memories, has provided a service in distributing a warm quilt to thousands, and has provided a way for me to make connections to those in our church and the community in many, many ways.

"One of the things I appreciate most about First Lutheran Church is the variety of ways people can connect with the church and one another--whether or not they are members of the congregation. The Mission Coffeehouse is a great example of this. When I started attending First Lutheran, talking to people in the coffeehouse after services is how I made connections, and it's something I still enjoy doing (when my small children allow).

I also enjoy having lunch at the coffeehouse and often suggest it when meeting friends or coworkers. Usually the people who join me for lunch have never been to the church, so being there provides a natural way for me to mention my involvement and why I enjoy being a member. I recently had lunch with a friend who doesn't attend church, and being in the coffeehouse sparked a discussion about faith and raising children that I don't think we would have had anywhere else. It was a great moment of connection for our friendship.

# Quilters hit goal of 400 quilts this year





Faye Dahl challenged the quilters to produce 400 quilts for Lutheran World Relief, and they reached that number by filling box #80 on September 5.

Faye then gifted each quilter with a tube of "advanced repair" hand lotion in recognition of the work!

Fall weather and activities are in the air! The First Lutheran Church (FLC) quilters are wrapping up a successful and active time of the year. On October 1st, 400 quilts from Brookings FLC will be loaded and shipped to Minneapolis as part of the Lutheran World Relief (LWR) world mission projects. The FLC quilters continue to create quilts from the fabric that has been donated by members of the congregation, area community groups, and/or purchased through Thrivent Action Project gift cards. In addition to the LWR project, quilts have also recently been donated to area agencies such as Sleep in Heavenly Peace and the Salvation Army, and lap robes have been gifted to care center residents or shut ins.

Remember to put Saturday, October 28th on your calendar to attend the Up Town Girls Craft Sale in the FLC activity center. The FLC quilters will be hosting a booth and selling quilts, lap/nap robes, pot holders, seasonal table runners, baby blankets, aprons, and more. Profits from these sales will be used to purchase fabric, help cover the shipping costs for the LWR mission quilts, and buy the special fabric used in quilts given to our high school graduating seniors this spring.

On behalf of the quilters, thank you to everyone for donating fabric, bed sheets, and blankets used for the quilts made this past year. We continue to need supplies and welcome all types of donations including memorials given throughout the year. We welcome additional individuals to help us rip, press, cut, create, sandwich, tie, and sew quilting projects! Thanks be to God!

Our children's ministry is off to a GREAT start this year. We are so excited to see our children and families back with us. We are excited to announce that many new friends have joined our Children's Ministry programming. PLEASE take the time to greet all our children, helping them to feel comfortable and welcome at FLC.

It often feels as though we are still coming out of the fog that was COVID. We work to navigate the "new" world formed from that experience. Despite the brief slow down in people's lives while practicing some caution, we find that lives have become even more full of activity. We continuously work to provide options that will allow children and their families the ability to make their faith journey a regular part of their routines. Currently some of the options provided by our ministry include Wednesday evening meals (open to everyone), Faith Steppingstones, Journey to Discipleship (wed. & Sun.), Faithful Family Events, Vacation Bible School, Lock-ins, Nursery Care, Children, Youth & Family Team (CYFT) and Sanctuary Bags. We welcome those who may have some extra time, talents, or gifts, to share with those walking their faith Journey. Currently FLC employees one full-time person to operate these programs. It is always a blessing for the children/families of our community to see representation of our church family through many faces. 
